36 Section 2. Paragraph (j) of subsection (2) of section 37 1003.621, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

38 1003.621 Academically high-performing school districts.-It 39 is the intent of the Legislature to recognize and reward school 40 districts that demonstrate the ability to consistently maintain 41 or improve their high-performing status. The purpose of this 42 section is to provide high-performing school districts with 43 flexibility in meeting the specific requirements in statute and 44 rules of the State Board of Education.

(2) COMPLIANCE WITH STATUTES AND RULES.—Each academically high-performing school district shall comply with all of the provisions in chapters 1000-1013, and rules of the State Board of Education which implement these provisions, pertaining to the following:
