10	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

12	Section 1. Use of state funds in support of boycotts;
13	prohibition
14	(1) The Legislature finds that it is beneficial to
15	students in this state to have access to an education that is
16	not bound by borders and to have the opportunity to obtain a
17	global education. The Legislature further finds that it is
18	important that the state undertake efforts to ensure that its
19	students succeed in a world that is continually becoming more
20	interdependent and that students have access to international
21	postsecondary education institutions. A global education allows
22	students to connect, compete, and cooperate with their peers
23	around the world. Therefore, it is the intent of the Legislature
24	to prohibit the state's public postsecondary education
25	institutions from using state funds to support academic entities
26	that have passed resolutions or taken official actions to

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27	promote discriminatory boycotts and thus limit academic
28	opportunities.
29	(2) For purposes of this section, the term:
30	(a) "Academic entity" means an organization that promotes
31	or supports academia in the United States or abroad.
32	(b) "Host country" means a country that hosts an
33	international program in which a public postsecondary education
34	institution participates.
35	(c) "Public postsecondary education institution" means a
36	Florida College System institution or a state university.
37	(3)(a) A public postsecondary education institution may
38	not use state funds provided directly to the institution to fund
39	an academic entity, provide funds for membership in an academic
40	entity, or fund travel or lodging for an institution employee to
41	attend a meeting of an academic entity if the entity has issued
42	a resolution or other official statement, or undertaken an
43	official action, boycotting a host country or a postsecondary
44	education institution located in a host country.
45	(b) A public postsecondary education institution is not
46	eligible to receive state funds during the academic year in
47	which the institution is in violation of paragraph (a).
48	(c) This section may not limit the attendance by an
49	employee of a public postsecondary education institution at an
50	event of an academic entity that boycotts a host country or a
51	postsecondary education institution located in a host country.
52	Attendance at a meeting of such entity may not be used by the
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53	public postsecondary education institution with regard to
54	employment decisions.
55	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014.

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
