8	Nigeria, more than 250 girls, aged 16 to 18, were captured and
9	kidnapped from their boarding school by the Boko Haram terrorist
10	group, and
11	WHEREAS, Boko Haram has been accused of abducting numerous
12	women and girls, some as young as 12 years of age, to traffic
13	them as sex slaves or force them to marry combatants, and
14	WHEREAS, according to the International Crisis Group, Boko
15	Haram's 5-year insurgency has grown more ruthless, violent, and
16	destructive, and has claimed the lives of more than 4,000 people
17	and forced almost half a million others to flee their homes, and
18	WHEREAS, more than 3 months have passed since the
19	abductions but little progress has been made towards freeing the
20	girls, and
21	WHEREAS, Boko Haram has openly threatened to sell the
22	abducted girls into slavery, and
23	WHEREAS, this outrage demands a significant worldwide
24	response to help rescue the abducted girls, combat Boko Haram in
