- (a) One representative from the state attorney's office.
- (b) One representative from the public defender's office for that county.
- (c) One representative from a law enforcement agency for that municipality or county.
 - (d) One local member of the clergy.

- (e) One local and licensed mental health expert.
- (f) One representative of the local school district.
- (g) One at-large citizen from the municipality or county where the shooting occurred.
- (2) A member shall serve a 1-year appointment, and a member may not serve consecutive appointments.
- (3) The advisory panel shall vote on whether to indict the law enforcement officer after its review. The state attorney shall consider the advisory panel's decision in his or her determination of whether to pursue an indictment against the law enforcement officer. If the advisory panel reaches a unanimous decision that an indictment shall be brought against the law enforcement officer, the state attorney must indict the law enforcement officer unless the state attorney provides conclusive contradictory evidence.
 - (4) This section expires on July 1, 2018.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2015.
