2           An act relating to state lotteries; amending s.  
3           24.121, F.S.; requiring the Department of the Lottery  
4           to split evenly the net revenue received from a  
5           specified instant lottery game between certain  
6           universities located in this state and direct service  
7           providers for funding breast cancer research and  
8           providing services for certain individuals who have  
9           breast cancer; restricting the use of funds; requiring  
10          that direct service providers be reimbursed on the  
11          basis of specified fee schedules for services,  
12          equipment, or supplies; requiring a direct service  
13          provider to provide a continuum of care; defining  
14          terms; creating s. 24.132, F.S.; requiring the  
15          department to offer a special instant lottery game  
16          called "Ticket for the Cure" for a specified time;  
17          prohibiting the department from unreasonably  
18          diminishing the efforts devoted to marketing other  
19          instant lottery games; requiring the department to  
20          allocate net revenue from such game to be used for  
21          funding breast cancer research and providing services  
22          for certain individuals who have breast cancer;  
23          restricting the use of funds; providing that the funds  
24          generated may not supplant those funds otherwise  
25          appropriated for breast cancer research by this state;  
26          defining terms; authorizing the department to adopt

27 rules; amending s. 381.93, F.S.; requiring the Mary  
 28 Brogan Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection  
 29 Program to be funded by certain state-appropriated  
 30 funds that match federal funds provided for screening  
 31 and early detection purposes; providing an effective  
 32 date.

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34 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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36 Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (5) of section  
 37 24.121, Florida Statutes, is amended, present paragraph (f) of  
 38 that subsection is redesignated as paragraph (g), and a new  
 39 paragraph (f) is added to that subsection, to read:

40 24.121 Allocation of revenues and expenditure of funds for  
 41 public education.—

42 (5)

43 (b) Except as provided in paragraphs (c)-(f) ~~(e)~~, ~~(d)~~, and  
 44 ~~(e)~~, the Legislature shall equitably apportion moneys in the  
 45 trust fund among public schools, community colleges, and  
 46 universities.

47 (f) The department shall split evenly the net revenue  
 48 received under s. 24.132 between public or private universities  
 49 located in this state which have medical research facilities or  
 50 which are associated with medical research facilities, and  
 51 direct service providers. The moneys shall be used for the  
 52 purposes of funding breast cancer research and providing

53 services for low-income, uninsured individuals who have breast  
 54 cancer. The funds may not be used for institutional,  
 55 organizational, or community-based overhead costs, indirect  
 56 costs, or levies. If services, equipment, or supplies are  
 57 provided by a direct service provider, the funds must be used to  
 58 pay for the services, equipment, or supplies based on the  
 59 Medicare fee schedule or the fee schedule resulting in the  
 60 lowest cost to the state. A direct service provider must provide  
 61 a continuum of care. As used in this paragraph, the term:

62 1. "Continuum of care" means a system that guides and  
 63 tracks patients over time through a comprehensive array of  
 64 health services spanning all levels and intensity of care.

65 2. "Direct service provider" means a nonuniversity  
 66 organization that provides care directly to an individual who  
 67 seeks services related to breast cancer.

68 Section 2. Section 24.132, Florida Statutes, is created to  
 69 read:

70 24.132 Ticket for the Cure.—

71 (1) The department shall offer a special instant lottery  
 72 game called "Ticket for the Cure." The game shall commence on  
 73 January 1, 2016, and shall be discontinued on December 31, 2021.  
 74 While instant lottery tickets are sold for the Ticket for the  
 75 Cure lottery game, the department may not unreasonably diminish  
 76 the efforts devoted to marketing other instant lottery games.

77 (2) The department shall allocate the net revenue from the  
 78 Ticket for the Cure lottery game pursuant to s. 24.121(5)(f) for

79 the purposes of funding breast cancer research and providing  
80 services for low-income, uninsured individuals who have breast  
81 cancer. The funds may not be used for institutional,  
82 organizational, or community-based overhead costs, indirect  
83 costs, or levies. The funds generated under this section may not  
84 supplant those funds otherwise appropriated for breast cancer  
85 research by this state. As used in this subsection, the term:

86 (a) "Net revenue" means the total amount of moneys  
87 received for instant lottery tickets that have been sold, less  
88 the sum of the amount paid out in prizes and the actual  
89 administrative expenses of the department related solely to the  
90 Ticket for the Cure lottery game.

91 (b) "Research" includes, but is not limited to,  
92 expenditures to develop and advance the understanding,  
93 techniques, and modalities that are effective in the detection,  
94 screening, prevention, and treatment of breast cancer, including  
95 clinical trials.

96 (3) The department may adopt rules to administer this  
97 section.

98 Section 3. Subsection (3) of section 381.93, Florida  
99 Statutes, is amended to read:

100 381.93 Breast and cervical cancer early detection  
101 program.—This section may be cited as the "Mary Brogan Breast  
102 and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program Act."

103 (3) The Mary Brogan Breast and Cervical Cancer Early  
104 Detection Program shall be funded through grants for such

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105 screening and early detection purposes from the federal Centers  
106 for Disease Control and Prevention under Title XV of the Public  
107 Health Service Act, 42 U.S.C. ss. 300k et seq. and through the  
108 appropriation of funds under the General Appropriations Act  
109 which must match the federal funds provided for screening and  
110 early detection purposes.

111 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2015.
