A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Community Inclusion and Life
Transition Advisory Councils; providing legislative
intent; creating a Community Inclusion and Life
Transition Advisory Council in each congressional
district of the state; administratively housing the
councils within the Department of Education; providing
for the appointment of council members and specifying
the composition of council membership; assigning
duties and responsibilities to the councils; requiring
the councils to annually submit a report to boards of
county commissioners, the Governor, and the
Legislature; authorizing reimbursement for per diem
and travel expenses for council members; providing an
effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. <u>Community Inclusion and Life Transition</u>
Advisory Councils.—

(1) LEGISLATIVE INTENT.—The Legislature intends to assist individuals with disabilities in making the transition from situations that have resulted in hardship to situations that allow them to pursue educational opportunities, gainful employment, and volunteerism through the creation of a Community Inclusion and Life Transition Advisory Council in each

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congressional district of this state.

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- (2) CREATION.—A Community Inclusion and Life Transition Advisory Council is created in each congressional district of this state. For administrative purposes only, the advisory councils are housed within the Department of Education, but shall independently exercise the duties and responsibilities specified in this section.
- MEMBERSHIP.—Each advisory council shall consist of 11 (3) members appointed by the Commissioner of Education with input from district school boards and the boards of county commissioners. The Commissioner of Education shall designate one appointee to each advisory council as the chairperson, who may vote only in the event of a tie. Members of the advisory council shall be appointed to 2-year terms. However, in order to achieve staggered terms, initial appointments to each advisory council shall consist of six members appointed to 1-year terms and five members appointed to 2-year terms. A vacancy on the board shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. A vacancy that occurs before the scheduled expiration of the member's term shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term. The advisory council membership should have general knowledge about issues that relate to community inclusion and life transition for persons with disabilities, and may include:
  - (a) An attorney specializing in disability law.
- (b) A business owner who employs an individual with an intellectual or physical disability.

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53	(c) A vocational rehabilitation counselor.
54	(d) The parent or guardian of an individual with an

56	(e) A teacher with experience in providing transition

72	(4) DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.—Each advisory council
73	shall, at a minimum:
74	(a) Conduct educational and outreach campaigns aimed at
75	transitioning individuals which demonstrate that working and
76	receiving benefits under the Social Security Disability

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Insurance program or the Supplemental Security Income program

can result in a more sustainable and independent lifestyle.

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(b) Seek funds for transition programs, participate in fundraising activities, and apply for grants.

- (c) Promote the creation of community partnerships that encourage greater community inclusion of all individuals, including opportunities for volunteerism.
  - (d) Determine the needs of transitioning individuals.
- (e) Recommend to boards of county commissioners, the Governor, and the Legislature ways to improve programs or services offered to assist transitioning individuals.
- (5) REPORT.—The advisory councils shall collaboratively prepare a report that contains a summary of the work of each council during the preceding year and any recommendations made by the councils pursuant to paragraph (4)(e). The report shall be submitted to boards of county commissioners, the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by December 1 of each year.
- (6) PER DIEM AND TRAVEL EXPENSES.—A member of an advisory council may not receive compensation for his or her service, but is entitled to receive reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses incurred in the performance of his or her duties, as provided in s. 112.061, Florida Statutes.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2015.
