31	Each voting member must maintain these qualifications and			
32	2 representative obligations throughout the term of appointment			
33	3 and comply with other member requirements established in this			
34	4 <u>article.</u>			
35	(c) In addition to these qualifications, each voting			
36	member must be a qualified elector of the City of Gainesville,			
37	except that:			
38	1. At all times, a minimum of one voting member must be a			
39	qualified elector of Alachua County, appointed from the			
40	unincorporated area of Alachua County ("county").			
41	2. The composition of the utilities commission shall be			
42	adjusted to reflect the ratio of total electric meters serving			
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43 customers in the unincorporated area of Alachua County to total 44 electric meters serving all electric customers based on the most 45 recent annual information provided by the utilities commission to the city commission. For example, at such time as the ratio 46 47 of total electric meters serving customers in the unincorporated 48 area of Alachua County to total electric meters serving all 49 electric customers reaches 40 percent, the city commission must 50 appoint a second voting member from the unincorporated area of 51 the county to serve the next term that would otherwise be served 52 by a qualified elector of the City of Gainesville. If the ratio subsequently falls below 40 percent, the city commission must 53 54 appoint a qualified elector of the City of Gainesville to serve 55 the next term that would otherwise be served by a qualified 56 elector from the unincorporated area of the county. 57 (d) The utilities commission shall have the power to make and adopt such rules and regulations, consistent with and not in 58 59 violation of this act and applicable law, as it deems prudent for the management, administration, and regulation of the 60 fiduciary, business, and other affairs of the utilities 61
