WHEREAS, the origins of the Seminole Tribe of Florida can be traced back 12,000 years, providing a unique insight into the language, art, and culture that shaped the historical legacy of all Floridians, and

WHEREAS, the Seminole Tribe of Florida has an established tradition of heroic action taken to maintain its independence and preserve its culture, and

WHEREAS, the Seminole Tribe of Florida has followed the storied American tradition of rising out of poverty into prosperity, and

WHEREAS, the Seminole Tribe of Florida promotes cultural attractions, such as the Ah-Tah-Thi-Ki Seminole Indian Museum, the Billie Swamp Safari, the Big Cypress RV Resort and Campground, and the Seminole Okalee Indian Village, which allow tourists to appreciate the Florida Everglades, and

WHEREAS, the Seminole Tribe of Florida employs more than 2,000 Floridians and purchases more than \$24 million annually in goods and services from more than 850 Florida vendors, and

WHEREAS, the Seminole Tribe of Florida is economically independent, relying on tourism and bingo profits to pay for infrastructure and schooling on the Seminole reservations, and WHEREAS, the Seminole Tribe of Florida has provided South
