Servicemembers of

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the United States Armed Forces, Reserve Forces, or National Guard perform among the most critical, most effective, and most dangerous operations in defense of our nation's freedom. The missions undertaken by servicemembers of the United States Armed Forces, Reserve Forces, or National Guard render these servicemembers and their spouses and children among the most critical assets worthy of protection in our state and country. The Legislature finds that allowing public access to identification and location information of current or former active duty servicemembers of the United States Armed Forces, Reserve Forces, or National Guard, and their spouses and children may jeopardize their safety. Therefore, the Legislature finds that protecting the home address, telephone number, date of birth, and photograph of a current or former active duty servicemember of the United States Armed Forces, Reserve Forces, Reserve Forces, Reserve Forces, the Legislature
