Senate Comm: RCS 03/12/2015 House

The Committee on Transportation (Brandes) recommended the following:

Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 322.051, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

322.051 Identification cards.-

(1) Any person who is 5 years of age or older, or any person who has a disability, regardless of age, who applies for a disabled parking permit under s. 320.0848, may be issued an

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11 identification card by the department upon completion of an 12 application and payment of an application fee.

(a) The application must include the following informationregarding the applicant:

Full name (first, middle or maiden, and last), gender,
 proof of social security card number satisfactory to the
 department, which may include a military identification card,
 county of residence, mailing address, proof of residential
 address satisfactory to the department, country of birth, and a
 brief description.

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2. Proof of birth date satisfactory to the department.

3. Proof of identity satisfactory to the department. Such proof must include one of the following documents issued to the applicant:

a. A driver license record or identification card record from another jurisdiction that required the applicant to submit a document for identification which is substantially similar to a document required under sub-subparagraph b., sub-subparagraph c., sub-subparagraph d., sub-subparagraph e., sub-subparagraph f., sub-subparagraph g., or sub-subparagraph h.;

31 32 b. A certified copy of a United States birth certificate;

c. A valid, unexpired United States passport;

33 d. A naturalization certificate issued by the United States34 Department of Homeland Security;

35 e. A valid, unexpired alien registration receipt card 36 (green card);

37 f. A Consular Report of Birth Abroad provided by the United38 States Department of State;

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g. An unexpired employment authorization card issued by the

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40 United States Department of Homeland Security; or

41 h. Proof of nonimmigrant classification provided by the United States Department of Homeland Security, for an original 42 43 identification card. In order to prove nonimmigrant classification, an applicant must provide at least one of the 44 45 following documents. In addition, the department may require 46 applicants to produce United States Department of Homeland 47 Security documents for the sole purpose of establishing the 48 maintenance of, or efforts to maintain, continuous lawful 49 presence:

(I) A notice of hearing from an immigration court scheduling a hearing on any proceeding.

(II) A notice from the Board of Immigration Appeals acknowledging pendency of an appeal.

(III) A notice of the approval of an application for adjustment of status issued by the United States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services.

(IV) An official documentation confirming the filing of a petition for asylum or refugee status or any other relief issued by the United States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services.

(V) A notice of action transferring any pending matter from
another jurisdiction to Florida, issued by the United States
Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services.

(VI) An order of an immigration judge or immigration
officer granting relief that authorizes the alien to live and
work in the United States, including, but not limited to,
asylum.

(VII) Evidence that an application is pending for

f. An order of an immigration judge or immigration officer granting relief that authorizes the alien to live and work in the United States, including, but not limited to, asylum.

g. Evidence that an application is pending for adjustment 142 of status to that of an alien lawfully admitted for permanent 143 residence in the United States or conditional permanent resident status in the United States, if a visa number is available 145 having a current priority date for processing by the United 146 States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services.

147 h. On or after January 1, 2010, an unexpired foreign passport with an unexpired United States Visa affixed, 148 149 accompanied by an approved I-94, documenting the most recent 150 admittance into the United States.

152 A driver license or temporary permit issued based on documents 153 required in subparagraph 7. or subparagraph 8. is valid for a 154 period not to exceed the expiration date of the document 155 presented or 1 year.

156	(d) Whether the applicant has previously been licensed to
157	drive, and, if so, when and by what state, and whether any such
158	license or driving privilege has ever been disqualified,
159	revoked, or suspended, or whether an application has ever been
160	refused, and, if so, the date of and reason for such
161	disqualification, suspension, revocation, or refusal.
162	(e) Each such application may include fingerprints and
163	other unique biometric means of identity.
