Section 14.292, Florida Statutes, is created to 13 read: 14 14.292 Florida Commission on Poverty.-15 There is established in the Executive Office of the (1) 16 Governor the Florida Commission on Poverty. The commission shall 17 serve as an advisory board to the Governor and Cabinet, the Legislature, and appropriate state agencies and entities on 18 19 matters relating to poverty. The commission shall consist of 5 voting members to be 20 (2) 21 appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate. A member 22 must be a resident of the state. Any number of nonvoting members 23 may be appointed by the Governor and may hold public office. 24 (3) Members of the commission shall be appointed for 4-25 year terms and may be reappointed for successive terms. A 26 vacancy shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term

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27	in the same manner as the original appointment.	
28	(4) The commission shall meet at the call of the chair or	
29	at the request of a majority of its total voting membership, but	
30	shall meet at least twice a year. A majority of the total voting	
31	membership shall constitute a quorum, and the affirmative vote	
32	of a majority of a quorum is necessary to take official action.	
33	(5) Members of the commission shall serve without	
34	compensation, but voting members shall be reimbursed for per	
35	diem and travel expenses in accordance with s. 112.061.	
36	(6) The commission shall:	
37	(a) Annually elect a chair and a vice chair. To be	
38	eligible to serve as chair, an individual must be a voting	
39	member of the commission.	
40	(b) Conduct a study and develop strategies to address the	
41	causes of poverty in the state.	
42	(c) Solicit the participation of counties in the study. A	
43	county that wishes to participate must submit an application to	
44	the commission that outlines current issues relating to poverty	
45	in that county. The commission shall develop procedures to	
46	approve or deny applications for participation.	
47	(d) Prepare an annual report detailing its activities	
48	during the preceding year and, to the extent practicable,	
49	compile and synthesize any reports that it accepted on behalf of	
50	the Governor. The commission's annual report shall be presented	
51	to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of	
52	the House of Representatives by January 15 of each year. The	
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53	report shall also include specific recommendations for any
54	necessary legislative, administrative, or regulatory reform, and
55	the commission's assessment of the state of poverty in the
56	state.
57	(7) The commission may:
58	(a) Secure assistance from all state departments and
59	agencies in order for the commission to avail itself of
60	expertise at minimal cost.
61	(b) Procure information and assistance from the state or
62	any political subdivision, municipality, public officer, or
63	governmental department or agency thereof.
64	(c) Contract for necessary goods and services.
65	(d) Apply for and accept funds, grants, gifts, and
66	services from any local government, state government, or the
67	Federal Government, or any of their agencies, or any other
68	public or private source for the purpose of defraying clerical
69	and administrative costs as may be necessary in carrying out its
70	duties under this section.
