14	WHEREAS, on August 12, 2000, 29-year-old Christian Darby
15	Stephenson was driving a gasoline tanker eastbound on the Hart
16	Bridge Expressway in Duval County, and
17	WHEREAS, a clogged drain had caused a large pool of
18	standing water to collect at the base of the bridge, and
19	WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation was responsible
20	for the maintenance of the drains at that location on the Hart
21	Bridge Expressway, and
22	WHEREAS, as Mr. Stephenson drove over the bridge, a Jeep
23	that was traveling toward the tanker hit the puddle and
24	hydroplaned, and
25	WHEREAS, Mr. Stephenson took evasive action to avoid
26	hitting the Jeep, as well as two other vehicles that had been ${\sf Page1of4}$

involved in previous accidents and were parked in the striped safety zone alongside the expressway, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Stephenson attempted to make a hard right turn onto the Atlantic Avenue exit so as to avoid the three vehicles, but, as he attempted to exit, the gasoline tanker jackknifed, struck the guardrail, overturned, and exploded, and

33 WHEREAS, Mr. Stephenson was subsequently pronounced dead at34 the scene, and

35 WHEREAS, Mr. Stephenson's widow, Amie Draiemann Stephenson, 36 brought suit against the Department of Transportation in the 37 Circuit Court of the Fourth Judicial Circuit in and for Duval 38 County, Case No. 01-03428 CA, and, on March 22, 2005, the jury 39 returned a verdict that assigned the Department of 40 Transportation with 36 percent of the negligence that was a 41 legal cause of Mr. Stephenson's death, and

42 WHEREAS, the jury verdict states the jury's determination 43 that the total amount of damages sustained by Mr. Stephenson's 44 estate is \$1.3 million; the total amount sustained by Amie Draiemann Stephenson, the widow of Mr. Stephenson, is \$763,000; 45 46 the total amount sustained by Hailey Morgan Stephenson, a 47 surviving minor child of Mr. Stephenson, is \$1 million; and the 48 total amount sustained by Christian Darby Stephenson II, a 49 surviving minor child of Mr. Stephenson, is \$526,000, and

50 WHEREAS, 36 percent of the aggregate sum of the damages 51 awarded to Mr. Stephenson's estate and the named survivors under 52 the final judgment is \$1,292,040, plus taxable costs, and Page 2 of 4

53 WHEREAS, after the Department of Transportation has paid 54 \$200,000, as allowed under s. 768.28, Florida Statutes, the remainder subject to being awarded under this act is \$1,092,040, 55 plus taxable costs, NOW, THEREFORE, 56 57 58 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 59 60 Section 1. The facts stated in the preamble to this act 61 are found and declared to be true. There is appropriated from the General Revenue 62 Section 2. 63 Fund to the Department of Transportation the sum of \$1,092,040 64 for the relief of Amie Draiemann Stephenson, as Personal 65 Representative of the Estate of Christian Darby Stephenson, for 66 the wrongful death of Christian Darby Stephenson. 67 Section 3. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to draw a warrant in the sum of \$1,092,040, plus taxable costs, upon the 68 69 funds of the Department of Transportation in the State Treasury 70 not otherwise appropriated payable to Amie Draiemann Stephenson, 71 as Personal Representative of the Estate of Christian Darby 72 Stephenson, to compensate Mrs. Stephenson and the surviving 73 minor children of Mr. and Mrs. Stephenson, Hailey Morgan 74 Stephenson and Christian Darby Stephenson II, for the wrongful 75 death of Christian Darby Stephenson. 76 Section 4.
