Subsection (3) of section 385.203, Florida 15 Statutes, is amended, paragraph (c) of subsection (1) is redesignated as paragraph (d), and a new paragraph (c) is added 16 17 to that subsection, to read: 385.203 Diabetes Advisory Council; creation; function; 18 19 membership.-20 (1)To guide a statewide comprehensive approach to 21 diabetes prevention, diagnosis, education, care, treatment, 22 impact, and costs thereof, there is created a Diabetes Advisory 23 Council that serves as the advisory unit to the Department of Health, other governmental agencies, professional and other 24 25 organizations, and the general public. 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27	Health Care Administration, and the Department of Management
28	Services, by January 10 of each odd-numbered year, submit to the
29	Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the
30	House of Representatives a report containing the following

32	1. The public health consequences and financial impact on
33	the state of all types of diabetes and resulting health
34	complications, including the number of persons with diabetes
35	covered by Medicaid, the number of persons with diabetes who are
36	insured by the Division of State Group Insurance, and the number
37	of persons with diabetes who are impacted by state agency
38	diabetes programs and activities.
39	2. A description and an assessment of the effectiveness of
40	the diabetes programs and activities implemented by each state
41	agency, the amount and source of funding for such programs and
42	activities, and the cost savings realized as a result of the
43	implementation of such programs and activities.
44	3. A description of the coordination among state agencies
45	of their respective programs, activities, and communications
46	designed to manage, treat, and prevent all types of diabetes.
47	4. The development of and revisions to a detailed action
48	plan for reducing and controlling the number of new cases of
49	diabetes and identification of proposed action steps to reduce
50	the impact of all types of diabetes, identification of expected
51	outcomes if the plan is implemented, and the establishment of
52	benchmarks for preventing and controlling diabetes.

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53 (3) The council shall be composed of 26 citizens of the 54 state who have knowledge of, or work in, the area of diabetes 55 mellitus as follows:

56 (a) Five interested citizens, three of whom are affected57 by diabetes.

58 (b) One member each from at least three of the medical 59 schools in the state.

60 (c) (b) Not more than 18 members, of whom not more than one 61 member each shall be from Twenty-one members, who must include 62 one representative from each of the following areas: nursing 63 with diabetes-educator certification; dietary with diabetes 64 educator certification; podiatry; ophthalmology or optometry; 65 psychology; pharmacy; adult endocrinology; pediatric 66 endocrinology; the American Diabetes Association (ADA); the 67 American Association of Diabetes Educators; the Juvenile 68 Diabetes Foundation (JDF); the Florida Academy of Family 69 Physicians; a community health center; a county health 70 department; an ADA-recognized American Diabetes Association 71 recognized community education program; each medical school in 72 the state; an osteopathic medical school; the insurance 73 industry; a Children's Medical Services diabetes regional 74 program; and an employer.

75 <u>(d) (e)</u> One or more representatives from the Department of 76 Health, who shall serve on the council as ex officio members. 77 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2015.

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
