(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, upon the filing of a petition as provided in this section, any court in the circuit in which the petitioner was arrested, so long as the court has jurisdiction over the class of offense or offenses sought to be expunged, the court of original jurisdiction over the crime sought to be expunged may order a criminal justice agency to expunge the criminal history record of a victim of human trafficking who complies with the requirements of this section. A petition need not be filed in the court where the petitioner's criminal proceeding or proceedings originally occurred. This section does not confer any right to the expunction of any criminal history record, and any request for
