Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Paragraph (d) of subsection (1) and paragraphs (d) and (e) of subsection (2) of section 320.0848, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

10 320.0848 Persons who have disabilities; issuance of 11 disabled parking permits; temporary permits; permits for certain 12 providers of transportation services to persons who have 13 disabilities.-

(d) Beginning October 1, 2012, the <u>The</u> department shall
renew the disabled parking permit of any person certified as
permanently disabled on the application if the person provides a

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certificate of disability issued within the last 12 months
pursuant to this subsection. A veteran who has been previously
evaluated and certified by the United States Department of
Veterans Affairs or any branch of the United States Armed Forces
as permanently and totally disabled from a service-connected
disability may provide a United States Department of Veterans
Affairs Form Letter 27-333, or its equivalent, issued within the
last 12 months in lieu of a certificate of disability.
(2) DISABLED PARKING PERMIT; PERSONS WITH LONG-TERM
MOBILITY PROBLEMS
(d) If an applicant who is a disabled veteran, is a
resident of this state, has been honorably discharged, and
either has been determined by the Department of Defense or the
United States Department of Veterans Affairs or its predecessor
to have a service-connected disability rating for compensation
of 50 percent or greater or has been determined to have a
service-connected disability rating of 50 percent or greater and
is in receipt of both disability retirement pay from the United
States Department of Veterans Affairs, he or she must still
provide a signed physician's statement of qualification for the
disabled parking permits.
(e) To obtain a replacement for a disabled parking permit
that has been lost or stolen, a person must submit an
application on a form prescribed by the department, provide a
certificate of disability issued within the last 12 months
pursuant to subsection (1), and pay a replacement fee in the

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44	amount of \$1, to be retained by the issuing agency. If the
45	person submits with the application a police report documenting
46	that the permit was stolen, there is no replacement fee. <u>A</u>
47	veteran who has been previously evaluated and certified by the
48	United States Department of Veterans Affairs or any branch of
