The Legislature recognizes that maintaining good oral health is integral to overall health status and that the good health of residents of this state is an important contributing factor in economic development. Better health, including better oral health, enables workers to be more productive, reduces the burden of health care costs, and enables children to improve in cognitive development. (1) As used in this section, the term: "Dental health professional shortage area" means a (a) geographic area so designated by the Health Resources and Services Administration of the United States Department of Health and Human Services. (b) "Department" means the Department of Health. (C) "Medically underserved area" means a geographic area so designated by the Health Resources and Services Administration of the United States Department of Health and Human Services. "Public health program" means a county health (d) department, the Children's Medical Services program, a federally qualified health center, a federally funded migrant health center, or other publicly funded or nonprofit health care program as designated by the department. The department shall develop and implement a dental (2) care access account initiative to benefit dentists licensed to practice in this state who demonstrate, as required by the department by rule:

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79	(a) Active employment by a public health program located
80	in a dental health professional shortage area or a medically
81	underserved area; or
82	(b) A commitment to opening a private practice in a dental
83	health professional shortage area or a medically underserved
84	area evidenced by residing in the designated area, maintaining
85	an active Medicaid provider agreement, enrolling in one or more
86	Medicaid managed care plans, expending sufficient capital to
87	make substantial progress in opening a dental practice that is
88	capable of serving at least 1,200 patients, and obtaining
89	financial support from the local community in which the dentist
90	is practicing or intending to open a practice.
91	(3) The department shall establish dental care access
92	accounts as individual benefit accounts for each dentist who
93	satisfies the requirements of subsection (2) and is selected by
94	the department for participation. The department shall implement
95	an electronic benefit transfer system that enables each dentist
96	to spend funds from his or her account for the purposes
97	described in subsection (4).
98	(4) Funds contributed from state and local sources to a
99	dental care access account may be used for one or more of the
100	following purposes:
101	(a) Repayment of dental school student loans.
102	(b) Investment in property, facilities, or equipment
103	necessary to establish and operate a dental office consisting of
104	no fewer than two operatories.
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105	(c) Payment of transitional expenses related to the
106	relocation or opening of a dental practice which are
107	specifically approved by the department.
108	(5) Subject to legislative appropriation, the department
109	shall distribute state funds as an award to each dental care
110	access account. Such awards must be in an amount not more than
111	\$100,000 and not less than \$10,000, except that a state award
112	may not exceed 3 times the amount contributed to an account in
113	the same year from local sources. If a dentist qualifies for a
114	dental care access account under paragraph (2)(a), the dentist's
115	salary and associated employer expenditures constitute a local
116	match and qualify the account for a state award if the salary
117	and associated expenditures do not come from state funds. State
118	funds may not be included in a determination of the amount
119	contributed to an account from local sources.
120	(6) The department may accept contributions of funds from
121	local sources for deposit in the account of a dentist designated
122	by the donor.
123	(7) The department shall close an account no later than 5
124	years after the first deposit of state or local funds into that
125	account or immediately upon the occurrence of any of the
126	following:
127	(a) Termination of the dentist's employment with a public
128	health program, unless, within 30 days after such termination,
129	the dentist opens a private practice in a dental health
130	professional shortage area or medically underserved area.
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131	(b) Termination of the dentist's practice in a designated
132	dental health professional shortage area or medically
133	underserved area.
134	(c) Termination of the dentist's participation in the
135	Florida Medicaid program.
136	(d) Participation by the dentist in any fraudulent
137	activity.
138	(8) Any state funds remaining in a closed account may be
139	awarded and transferred to another account concurrent with the
140	distribution of funds under the next legislative appropriation
141	for the initiative. The department shall return to the donor on
142	a pro rata basis unspent funds from local sources which remain
143	in a closed account.
144	(9) If the department determines that a dentist has
145	withdrawn account funds after the occurrence of an event
146	specified in subsection (7), has used funds for purposes not
147	authorized in subsection (4), or has not remained eligible for a
148	dental care access account for at least 2 years, the dentist
149	shall repay the funds to his or her account. The department may
150	recover the withdrawn funds through disciplinary enforcement
151	actions and other methods authorized by law.
152	(10) The department shall establish by rule:
153	(a) Application procedures for dentists who wish to apply
154	for a dental care access account. An applicant may demonstrate
155	that he or she has expended sufficient capital to make
156	substantial progress in opening a dental practice that is

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157	capable of serving at least 1,200 patients by documenting
158	contracts for the purchase or lease of a practice location and
159	providing executed obligations for the purchase or other
160	acquisition of at least 30 percent of the value of equipment or
161	supplies necessary to operate a dental practice. The department
162	may limit the number of applicants selected and shall give
163	priority to those applicants practicing in the areas receiving
164	higher rankings pursuant to subsection (11). The department may
165	establish additional criteria for selection which recognize an
166	applicant's active engagement with and commitment to the
167	community providing a local match.
168	(b) A process to verify that funds withdrawn from a dental
169	care access account are used solely for the purposes described
170	in subsection (4).
171	(11) The Department of Economic Opportunity shall rank the
172	dental health professional shortage areas and medically
173	underserved areas of the state based on the extent to which
174	limited access to dental care is impeding the area's economic
175	development, with a higher ranking indicating a greater
176	impediment to development.
177	(12) The department shall develop a marketing plan for the
178	dental care access account initiative in cooperation with the
179	University of Florida College of Dentistry, the Nova
180	Southeastern University College of Dental Medicine, the Lake
181	Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine School of Dental Medicine,
182	and the Florida Dental Association.
