3	"Child Safety Awareness Month" in the State of

6	WHEREAS, according to the National Safety Council, the
7	leading cause of death for children between the ages of 1 and 4 $$
8	years is unintentional injury in and around the home, including
9	falls, drowning, choking, suffocating, burns, and poisoning,
10	with almost 4,000 fatalities and more than 4.5 million injuries
11	each year, and
12	WHEREAS, heights, water, choking and suffocation hazards,
13	electrical equipment, fires, pharmaceuticals, and cleaning
14	products pose serious risks to children, and
15	WHEREAS, childproofing is an ongoing task that increases
16	the amount of time often needed for children to get into
17	dangerous situations, but it is no substitute for adult
18	supervision, and
19	WHEREAS, adult guidance and supervision, including
20	educating children about these various safety risks, is the most
21	effective strategy for preventing childhood injuries, and
22	WHEREAS, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety
23	Administration, three out of four child safety seats are
24	improperly installed in vehicles, with many adults completely
25	unaware that they have incorrectly installed a child safety seat

26 or have prematurely transitioned a school-age child from a child 27 restraint to a seat belt, and WHEREAS, abduction, bullying, child abuse, homelessness, 28 29 and depression are also dangerous issues affecting children 30 today, and 31 WHEREAS, educating parents, the community, and society as a 32 whole about ways to keep children safe at home, on the road, and 33 at play is critical because adults play a vital role in 34 protecting the health and well-being of children, Florida's most 35 precious assets, NOW, THEREFORE, 36 37 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of 38 Florida: 39 40 That the month of September is designated as "Child Safety Awareness Month" in the State of Florida and all citizens are 41 42 encouraged to evaluate the safety and protection devices and 43 plans they have in place for their children.
