HR 9085 2015

House Resolution

A resolution designating October 13, 2015, as Huntington's Disease Blue Ribbon Day in the State of Florida.

WHEREAS, Huntington's disease is a progressive degenerative neurological disease affecting 30,000 North Americans while another 200,000 are genetically at risk of inheriting the gene responsible for causing the disease, and

WHEREAS, the average lifespan after onset of Huntington's disease is 10 to 20 years, and the younger the age of onset, the more rapid the progression of the disease, resulting in children who develop the juvenile form of the disease rarely living to adulthood, and

WHEREAS, since the discovery of the gene that causes
Huntington's disease in 1993, the pace of research has
accelerated, though at present there is no effective treatment
or cure, and

WHEREAS, it is critical to the success of research and support services to raise awareness about Huntington's disease in the general public and medical community, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

HR 9085 2015

That October 13, 2015, is designated as Huntington's
Disease Blue Ribbon Day in the State of Florida.

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
