WHEREAS, two species of lionfish, Pterois volitans and Pterois miles, are found in Florida's waters, and

WHEREAS, lionfish are known to cause detrimental effects to native marine life, including important commercial, recreational, and ecological species of fish and invertebrates, and

WHEREAS, while some lionfish are incidentally captured in the lobster trap fishery, much of the lionfish population is being controlled by divers and snorkelers at accessible locations through regular removals and removal events, and

WHEREAS, removal efforts are showing success at reducing lionfish populations and maintaining low densities, and

WHEREAS, lionfish are being commercially sold and consumed as a food fish in Florida and throughout the United States, which provides an incentive to remove larger invasive lionfish, and

WHEREAS, lionfish, extremely popular in the home aquarium trade, are being imported from their native range to supply this trade, and Florida's marine life collectors are able to collect and sell lionfish into the trade, and

WHEREAS, the collection and sale of these fish provides an incentive to remove smaller lionfish before they can mature and reproduce, and

WHEREAS, continued outreach and education efforts regarding lionfish can positively influence the public to engage in removal efforts, NOW, THEREFORE,
