5 Between lines 583 and 584, insert:

7 Section 18. Section 570.695, Florida Statutes, is created
 8 to read:

9 570.695 Florida veteran identification card.—Beginning on
 10 January 1, 2016, the department may issue Florida veteran
 11 identification cards. Each card must bear a color photograph of
 12 the card holder for verification purposes.

13 (1) The department shall issue a Florida veteran
 14 identification card to any applicant who is a veteran as defined
 15 in s. 1.01(14), resides in this state, submits a completed
 16 application provided by the department with accompanying
 17 documents, and pays the application fee.

18 (2) The application shall be limited to the following:

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- 19 (a) Full name (first, middle or maiden, and last);
20 (b) Mailing address;
21 (c) Branch of service;
22 (d) Optional contact telephone number or e-mail address;
23 and
24 (e) Statement regarding Florida residency.
25 (3) The application must be signed and verified by an
26 individual under oath as provided in s. 92.525(2).
27 (4) The applicant shall submit all of the following
28 documents to the department:
29 (a) A completed application.
30 (b) A copy of the applicant's DD Form 214, DD Form 256, or
31 WD AGO, issued by the United States Department of Defense, which
32 displays the applicant's discharge status. Alternatively, an
33 applicant may provide a copy of his or her valid Florida driver
34 license bearing a "V" or "Veteran" designation.
35 (c) A full frontal color photograph of the applicant taken
36 within the preceding 90 days in which the head, including hair,
37 measures 7/8 of an inch wide and 1 1/8 inches high.
38 (5) An applicant must submit a fee of \$15 to cover the cost
39 of issuing the license with any balance distributed to Friends
40 of Florida State Forests, Inc., for the sole purpose of
41 supporting the Operation Outdoor Freedom.
42 (6) Upon receipt of the fee and the documents listed in
43 subsection (4), the department shall:
44 (a) Issue the Florida veteran identification card; or
45 (b) Return the application as incomplete and allow the
46 applicant to resubmit it. The application fee shall be refunded

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47 to an applicant who requests a refund based on inability to
48 provide a completed application. The determination of the
49 department that an application is incomplete is not subject to
50 the requirements contained in chapter 120.

51 (7) A Florida veteran identification card does not expire.
52 If the card is lost, a replacement card shall be issued provided
53 the applicant meets the requirements of this section.

54 (8) All moneys required to be paid under this section shall
55 be collected by the department and deposited into the Division
56 of Licensing Trust Fund. Notwithstanding s. 493.6117, all moneys
57 collected pursuant to this section shall not revert to the
58 General Revenue Fund; however, this shall not abrogate the
59 requirement for payment of the service charge imposed pursuant
60 to chapter 215.

61 Section 19. For the 2015-2016 fiscal year, the sums of \$114,018
62 in recurring funds and \$140,282 in nonrecurring funds are
63 appropriated from the Division of Licensing Trust Fund to the
64 Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, and one full-
65 time equivalent position with associated salary rate of 31,109
66 is authorized, for the purpose of implementing section 18 of
67 this act.
