3	markets; creating s. 414.456, F.S.; providing
4	definitions; authorizing certain owners and operators
5	of farmers' markets, community farmers' markets, flea
6	markets, and other open-air markets selling fresh
7	produce to allow authorized Food and Nutrition Service
8	groups, associations, and third-party organizations to
9	operate electronic benefits transfer systems in such
10	markets; providing restrictions on the use of
11	Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits in
12	such markets; providing applicability; providing an
13	effective date.

15	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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17	Section 1. Section 414.456, Florida Statutes, is created
18	to read:
19	414.456 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program;
20	transactions in fresh produce markets
21	(1) As used in this section, the term:
22	(a) "Market" means a farmers' market, community farmers'
23	market, flea market, or other open-air market.
24	(b) "SNAP" means the federal Supplemental Nutrition
25	Assistance Program established under 7 U.S.C. ss. 2011 et seq.
26	(2)(a) The owner or operator of a market selling fresh
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27	produce who is not an authorized SNAP retailer may allow an
28	authorized Food and Nutrition Service group or association of
29	produce sellers that is actively participating in produce sales
30	in the market, or an authorized Food and Nutrition Service
31	third-party organization, to implement and operate an electronic
32	benefits transfer system for purposes of accepting SNAP benefits
33	in the market on behalf of the produce sellers to the extent and
34	manner allowed by federal law and regulation.
35	(b) The authorized Food and Nutrition Service group,
36	association, or third-party organization responsible for
37	implementation and operation of the electronic benefits transfer
38	system may not be another market that competes with the market
39	being served.
40	(c) The market owner or operator shall reasonably
41	accommodate the authorized Food and Nutrition Service group,
42	association, or third-party organization in the implementation
43	and operation of an electronic benefits transfer system for
44	purposes of accepting SNAP benefits.
45	(d) SNAP benefits may only be used for the purchase of
46	fresh produce or other fresh food on a dollar-for-dollar basis
47	and may not be traded for tokens or other means of trade for
48	nonproduce items.
49	(3) This section does not:
50	(a) Apply to a market selling fresh produce whose owner or
51	operator has an electronic benefits transfer system for
52	accepting SNAP benefits in the market.
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53	(b) Prohibit an authorized Food and Nutrition Service				
54	produce seller in a market selling fresh produce from operating				
55	his or her own electronic benefits transfer system as part of				
56	his or her customer transaction options.				
57	(c) Require a market owner or operator to create, operate,				
58	or maintain an electronic benefits transfer system on behalf of				
59	its produce sellers.				
60	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2016.				

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
