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A certified school counselor must provide a student-

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centered, data-informed, and outcome-oriented program that is integrated into curricula and that prepares students in prekindergarten through grade 12 for postsecondary education and training or a career. The program must be designed using the Department of Education's Florida's School Counseling Framework.

- (4) A certified school counselor must spend a minimum of 80 percent of his or her contracted work time on the delivery of services. As used in this section, the term "delivery of services" means working directly with students, faculty, administrators, parents, school staff, and the community to achieve an integrated approach to the student's educational success and an effective transition to postsecondary education and training or a career. These counseling services may include the services recommended by the American School Counselor Association and the following comprehensive counseling services:
 - (a) Academic and social counseling.

- (b) Core curricula programming with structured lessons designed to meet the student standards and competencies in Florida's School Counseling Framework.
- (c) Career and educational counseling, including, but not limited to, helping students make informed academic and career choices using multiple student data sources and education and career placement services.
 - (d) Individual and group counseling.
 - (e) Crisis intervention and preventive counseling.
 - (f) Referrals to community agencies.
