Section 2. Section 316.306, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

316.306 Use of cellular telephone or wireless communications device in school zone; prohibition.—

- (1) A person may not operate a motor vehicle in a legally posted school zone or designated school crossing or on school district property while using any type of cellular telephone or wireless communications device as defined in s. 316.305 or while sending or reading data on such a device for the purpose of communication, including, but not limited to, texting, emailing, and instant messaging.
- (2) A person who violates this section commits a noncriminal traffic infraction, punishable as a moving violation as provided in chapter 318.

Section 3. This act shall take effect October 1, 2016.
