Section 1. Section 1003.4996, Florida Statutes, is created
to read:

Program.—Subject to appropriation, beginning with the 2016-2017 school year, the Competency-Based Computer Learning Pilot

Program is created within the Department of Education to be administered for 5 years. The purpose of the pilot program is to provide an educational environment that allows students to advance to higher levels of learning upon the mastery of concepts and skills through the use of a competency-based

- (1) PROGRAM PARTICIPATION.—A school district may submit an application in a format prescribed by the department to participate in the pilot program. The department shall select one school district with a population of more than 500,000, one school district with a population of at least 100,000 but not more than 500,000, and one school district with a population of fewer than 100,000 to participate in the pilot program.
- (2) APPLICATION.—The application to participate in the pilot program must, at a minimum, include:
- (a) A list of the schools that will participate in the pilot program.
- (b) The annual goals and performance outcomes for participating schools, including, but not limited to:
  - 1. Student performance as defined in s. 1008.34.
  - 2. Promotion and retention rates.
  - 3. Graduation rates.
  - 4. Indicators of college and career readiness.
- (c) A communication plan for parents and other stakeholders, including local businesses and community members.
- (d) The scope of and timelines for professional development for school instructional and administrative personnel.

- (f) A plan for using a competency-based computer learning program.
- (g) The rules to be waived for participating schools pursuant to subsection (3) to implement the pilot program.
- (3) EXEMPTION FROM RULES.—In addition to the waivers authorized in s. 1001.10(3), the State Board of Education may authorize the commissioner to grant an additional waiver of rules relating to student progression and the awarding of credits.
- (4) STUDENT FUNDING.—Students enrolled in a participating school shall be reported for and generate funding pursuant to s. 1011.62.
- (5) PARTICIPATING SCHOOL DISTRICT DUTIES.—Participating school districts shall:
  - (a) During the 2016-2017 school year:
- 1. Using funds provided by the department, ensure that participating schools have enough computers or tablets for at least 90 percent of the enrolled students and a sufficient infrastructure to implement the pilot program.
- 2. Develop a request for proposals for providers of competency-based computer learning programs.

- (b) During the 2017-2018 school year, issue the request for proposals and, from the competitive bids received, contract with a provider of a competency-based computer learning program. At least three competitive bids must be solicited through the request for proposals. The contract with such provider shall be for 2 years. At the completion of the contract, the school district may renew the contract or issue another request for proposals.
  - (c) During the 2018-2019 school year:
- 1. Implement the competency-based computer learning program in each classroom and for each academic subject in the participating schools and daily monitor each student's achievement of the state standards and benchmarks. Classroom teachers must use the competency-based computer learning program to guide day-to-day classroom instruction.
- 2. Require classroom teachers at participating schools to complete continuing education courses relating to digital learning, competency-based computer learning programs, and techniques for utilizing such programs in at least two quarters annually.
  - (d) During the 2019-2020 school year:
- 1. Continue implementing the competency-based computer learning program and daily monitoring of each student's achievement of the state standards and benchmarks.
- 2. Require classroom teachers at participating schools to complete continuing education courses relating to digital

  - 3. Using the student data available through the competency-based computer learning program for the previous and current school years, evaluate each student's achievement of the state standards and benchmarks.
  - 4. Suspend the statewide, standardized assessment program under s. 1008.22 in participating schools if student achievement of the state standards and benchmarks improves, based on criteria adopted by the department.
    - (e) During the 2020-2021 school year:
  - 1. Continue implementing the competency-based computer learning program and daily monitoring of each student's achievement of the state standards and benchmarks.
  - 2. Require classroom teachers at participating schools to complete continuing education courses relating to digital learning, competency-based computer learning programs, and techniques for utilizing such programs in at least two quarters annually.
  - 3. Submit to the department all student data relating to the pilot program, a list of best management practices for implementing a competency-based computer learning program, and information relating to the measures used to evaluate and monitor a student's achievement of the state standards and benchmarks.

(6)	DEPARTMENT	DUTIES.	-The	department	shall:
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- (a) Provide funding to participating school districts for the implementation of the pilot program.
- (b) Provide guidance and support to participating school districts during the development and issuance of the districts' request for proposals.
- (c) Provide guidelines for ensuring that the competency-based computer learning programs meet the state standards.
- (d) Upon receipt of the information required under subparagraph (5)(e)4., determine if competency-based computer learning is more effective than summative learning. If it is determined that competency-based computer learning is more effective, the department shall provide recommendations to the Legislature and the State Board of Education regarding transitioning the state's public schools to competency-based computer learning and suspending the statewide, standardized assessment program under s. 1008.22.
- (7) COMPETENCY-BASED COMPUTER LEARNING PROGRAM

  REQUIREMENTS.—To be used in a participating school district, a competency-based computer learning program must:
  - (a) Meet the state standards established in s. 1003.41.
- (b) Allow the tracking of student data through daily assessments to demonstrate the progress of each student's achievement of the state standards and benchmarks.
- (c) Facilitate the adjustment of the daily curriculum to meet each student's educational needs.
