22	(j) The Auditor General shall notify the Legislative
23	Auditing Committee of any financial or operational audit report
24	prepared pursuant to this section which indicates that a
25	district school board , state university, or Florida College
26	System institution has failed to take full corrective action in
27	response to a recommendation that was included in the two
28	preceding financial or operational audit reports.

31	System institution to provide a written statement to the
32	committee explaining why full corrective action has not been

72	(a) Additional information to be added to a website, such
73	as whether to expand the scope of the information provided to
74	include state universities, Florida College System institutions,
75	school districts, charter schools, charter technical career
76	centers, local government units, and other governmental
77	entities.
78	(b) A schedule for adding information to the website by
79	type of information and governmental entity, including
80	timeframes and development entity.
81	(c) A format for collecting and displaying the additional
82	information.
83	(8) The manager of each website described in subsections
84	(4), (5), and (6) shall submit to the committee information
85	relating to the cost of creating and maintaining such website,
86	and the number of times the website has been accessed.
87	(9) The committee shall coordinate with the Financial
88	Management Information Board in developing recommendations for
89	including information on the website which is necessary to meet
90	the requirements of s. 215.91(8).

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91	(13) The committee shall prepare an annual report detailing
92	progress in establishing the single website and providing
93	recommendations for enhancement of the content and format of the
94	website and related policies and procedures. The report shall be
95	submitted to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the
96	Speaker of the House of Representatives by November 1.
97	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2016.
