Senate Resolution

A resolution recognizing February 11, 2016, as "Florida Muslim Capitol Day."

WHEREAS, Florida Muslim Capitol Day was created by and for American Muslims living in this state to increase their civic engagement and political participation, and

WHEREAS, Florida Muslim Capitol Day is an annual community-based event organized through the collaborative leadership of the Florida Muslim community to educate Muslims on the state's political process and to encourage them to engage in political activism in Florida, and

WHEREAS, the Pew Research Center estimates that there are 3.3 million Muslims now living in the United States, composing about 1 percent of the total population, a figure that is expected to double by 2050, and

WHEREAS, approximately 523,000 Muslims, or 3 percent of the total Florida population, currently reside in Florida's 67 counties, and

WHEREAS, Florida is home to one of the most diverse Muslim populations in the world and includes people of every school of thought and ethnic groups originating from more than 80 countries on four continents, and

WHEREAS, Florida's Muslim community includes immigrants and second- and third-generation Arabs, Latinos, Asians, Europeans, and Africans, and

WHEREAS, persons from Southeast Asia and Arab nations each compose about a third of Florida's Muslim population, American-born blacks compose a fifth of the total, and a growing number of Muslims in this state are native-born Anglo and Hispanic converts, and

WHEREAS, a survey released by the Public Religion Research

Institute shows that Floridians' perceptions of Muslims have turned increasingly negative in recent years, with 56 percent of those surveyed expressing the belief that the values of Muslims are at odds with American values and our way of life, up from 47 percent who expressed that belief in 2011, and

WHEREAS, to combat these alarming statistics, Florida Muslim Capitol Day brings hundreds of Muslim leaders, community members, and students from across the state to Tallahassee to meet with elected officials, and

WHEREAS, Florida Muslim Capitol Day empowers the Florida Muslim community to participate in the state's democratic political process, to not be intimidated and silenced by the voices of intolerance, and to inform Florida's elected officials about the concerns of their Muslim constituents, and

WHEREAS, the growth of the American Muslim community has fostered the development of a variety of religious, civic, political, cultural, economic, social, ethnic, feminist, artistic, and professional organizations, and it is fitting to recognize and commend Florida Muslims who are at the forefront of civic engagement as informed, effective, and responsible citizens, NOW, THEREFORE,
