

1 A bill to be entitled
 2 An act relating to specialty license plates; amending
 3 ss. 320.08056 and 320.08058, F.S.; directing the
 4 Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to
 5 develop a Sun Sea Smiles license plate; establishing
 6 an annual use fee for the plate; providing for
 7 distribution and use of fees collected from the sale
 8 of the plates; providing an effective date.

 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

 12 Section 1. Paragraph (ffff) is added to subsection (4) of
 13 section 320.08056, Florida Statutes, to read:

14 320.08056 Specialty license plates.—

15 (4) The following license plate annual use fees shall be
 16 collected for the appropriate specialty license plates:

17 (ffff) Sun Sea Smiles license plate, \$25.

18 Section 2. Subsection (84) is added to section 320.08058,
 19 Florida Statutes, to read:

20 320.08058 Specialty license plates.—

21 (84) SUN SEA SMILES LICENSE PLATES.—

22 (a) The department shall develop a Sun Sea Smiles license
 23 plate as provided in this section. The plate must bear the
 24 colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida"
 25 must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Sun Sea
 26 Smiles" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

27 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
 28 be distributed as follows:

29 1. Five percent shall be distributed to the Florida
 30 Caribbean Charitable Foundation, Inc., strictly for marketing of
 31 the Sun Sea Smiles license plate.

32 2. Thirty percent shall be distributed to the Florida
 33 Caribbean Charitable Foundation, Inc. Of this amount, up to 5
 34 percent may be used for administrative expenses, and the
 35 remainder shall be used as follows:

36 a. Sixty percent shall be used for a college scholarship
 37 program.

38 b. Fifteen percent shall be used to promote health and
 39 wellness among Florida residents of Caribbean descent.

40 c. Twenty-five percent shall be used to promote awareness
 41 of Caribbean culture within the state.

42 3. Twenty percent shall be distributed to the American
 43 Friends of Jamaica, Inc., a charitable, not-for-profit
 44 organization under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code
 45 registered with the Department of Agriculture and Consumer
 46 Services and incorporated in New York, for use as grants to
 47 promote social and community development among Florida
 48 residents. Of this amount, up to 5 percent may be used for
 49 administrative and marketing expenses.

50 4. Ten percent shall be distributed to Haitian
 51 Neighborhood Center Sant La, Inc., to promote social and

52 community development. Of this amount, up to 5 percent may be
53 used for administrative expenses.

54 5. Ten percent shall be distributed to Fanm Ayisyen Nan
55 Miyami, Inc., to promote social and community development. Of
56 this amount, up to 10 percent may be used for administrative
57 expenses.

58 6. Twenty percent shall be distributed to Greater
59 Caribbean American Cultural Coalition, Inc., to promote
60 awareness of Caribbean culture within the state. Of this amount,
61 up to 5 percent may be used for administrative expenses.

62 7. Five percent shall be distributed to Little Haiti
63 Optimist Foundation, Inc., to promote awareness of Caribbean
64 culture and youth development within the state. Of this amount,
65 up to 5 percent may be used for administrative expenses.

66 Section 3. This act shall take effect October 1, 2016.
