calculated by dividing the total potential funds, not including
Florida School Recognition Program funds and the minimum
guarantee funds, for all districts by the state total FTE
student count.

For districts that have a levy value per FTE as 39 calculated in subparagraph 1. higher than the state average 40 calculated in subparagraph 2., a sparsity wealth adjustment 41 shall be calculated as the product of the difference between the 42 state average levy value per FTE calculated in subparagraph 2. and the district's levy value per FTE calculated in subparagraph 43 44 1. and the district's FTE student count and -1.
