 7 Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSA) is designated
 8 ~~as~~ the governing nonprofit association for purposes of
 9 membership in the National Federation of State High School
 10 Associations ~~organization of athletics in Florida public~~
 11 ~~schools~~. If, at any time, the FHSA fails to meet the provisions
 12 of this part section, the commissioner, with the approval of the
 13 State Board of Education, shall designate another a nonprofit
 14 association ~~organization~~ to govern interscholastic athletic
 15 competition in this state and serve as Florida's voting member
 16 association of the National Federation of State High School
 17 Associations ~~athletics with the approval of the State Board of~~

18 ~~Education.~~ The FHSAA is not a state agency as defined in s.
19 120.52 but is. ~~The FHSAA shall be subject to ss. 1006.15-~~
20 1006.19. Any special event fees, sanctioning fees, including
21 third-party sanctioning fees, or contest receipts collected
22 annually by the FHSAA may not exceed its actual costs to perform
23 the function or duty that is the subject of or justification for
24 the fee the provisions of s. 1006.19. The FHSAA shall offer
25 spectators seeking admission to interscholastic athletic
26 competitions the option of purchasing a single-day pass or a
27 multiple-day pass that is at a cost below that which one would
28 pay on a per-event basis for the same number of contests. A
29 ~~private school that wishes to engage in high school athletic~~
30 ~~competition with a public high school may become a member of the~~
31 ~~FHSAA.~~ Any high school in the state, including private schools,
32 traditional public schools, charter schools, virtual schools,
33 and home education cooperatives, may become a member of the
34 FHSAA and participate in the activities of the FHSAA. ~~However,~~
35 Membership in the FHSAA is not mandatory for any school. The
36 FHSAA shall allow a school the option of joining the association
37 as a full-time member or on a per-sport basis and may not
38 prohibit or discourage any school from simultaneously
39 maintaining membership in the FHSAA and another athletic
40 association. The FHSAA may not:
41 (a) Deny or discourage interscholastic athletic
42 competition between its member schools and nonmember non-FHSAA
43 ~~member Florida~~ schools, including members of another athletic

45 (b) Engage in any retributory or discriminatory action
46 against any of its member schools that seek to participate in
47 interscholastic athletic competition with nonmember non-FHSAA
48 member Florida schools or become members in other associations
49 for a sport for which they are not a member of the FHSAA. The
50 FHSAA may not unreasonably withhold

51 (c) Withhold its approval of an application to become an
52 affiliate member of the National Federation of State High School
53 Associations submitted by any other association organization
54 that governs interscholastic athletic competition in this state
55 which meets the requirements of the National Federation of State
56 High School Associations. The commissioner may identify other
57 associations that govern interscholastic athletic competition in
58 compliance with the requirements of the National Federation of
59 State High School Associations. The bylaws of the FHSAA are the
60 rules by which high school athletic programs in its member
61 schools, and the students who participate in them, are governed,
62 unless otherwise specifically provided by statute. For the
63 purposes of this section, "high school" includes grades 6
64 through 12.
