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18	(1) As used in this section, the term "competitive and	
19	integrated employment" means employment in the public or private	
20	sector in which the employee earns comparable wages and	
21	benefits, commensurate with his or her qualifications and

24	profession.	
25	(2) The program shall to provide personal care attendants	
26	and other support and services necessary to enable to persons	
27	eligible under subsection (3) who have significant severe and	
28	chronic disabilities to obtain or maintain competitive and	
29	integrated employment, including self-employment of all kinds	
30	and who are eligible under subsection (1). Effective July 1,	
31	2008, the Florida Association of Centers for Independent Living

129 413.4021 Program participant selection; tax collection 130 enforcement diversion program.-The Department of Revenue, in 131 coordination with the Florida Association of Centers for 132 Independent Living and the Florida Prosecuting Attorneys 133 Association, shall select judicial circuits in which to operate 134 the program. The association and the state attorneys' offices 135 shall develop and implement a tax collection enforcement 136 diversion program, which shall collect revenue due from persons who have not remitted their collected sales tax. The criteria 137 138 for referral to the tax collection enforcement diversion program shall be determined cooperatively between the state attorneys' 139 offices and the Department of Revenue. 140
