Section 627.6442, Florida Statutes, is created 34 to read: 35 627.6442 Provision of pharmaceutical services.-A health 36 insurance policy, plan, or other contract for health care 37 services issued, delivered, or renewed by a health insurer in 38 this state must not require an insured living with a chronic 39 illness to obtain pharmaceutical services, including prescription drugs, exclusively from a mail order pharmacy. As 40 41 used in this section, the term "chronic illness" means human 42 immunodeficiency virus (HIV) infection, epilepsy, hypertension, 43 or diabetes. 117	(c) A health maintenance organization that contracts with
118	a mail order pharmacy to provide pharmaceutical services under a
119	health maintenance contract shall include a contract provision
120	requiring the mail order pharmacy to disclose in its initial
121	written correspondence with a subscriber living with a chronic
122	illness that such subscriber may obtain pharmaceutical services
123	from other providers of pharmaceutical services and that the
124	exclusive use of a mail order pharmacy is not required.
125	(d) Upon written request to the health maintenance
126	organization, a pharmacy that desires to provide services to
127	subscribers living with a chronic illness in the pharmacy's
128	service area shall be provided information pertaining to the
129	terms and conditions applicable to mail order pharmacies
130	available in that service area. If the pharmacy agrees to the
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131	same terms and conditions in writing and agrees to be paid at no
132	more than the amount that would be paid to a mail order pharmacy
133	for the same services, the organization shall pay the pharmacy
134	the same amount paid to the mail order pharmacy for the same
135	pharmaceutical services.
