The agency shall implement separate statewide Medicaid prepaid programs to provide coverage for: chiropractic services; hearing services; home health agency services; laboratory and imaging services; medical supplies and equipment; prostheses and orthoses; mental health services; optical services and supplies; optometrist services; physical, occupational, respiratory, and speech therapy services; prescription drugs; substance abuse treatment services; and transportation to access covered services. The agency shall contract with at least two licensed managed care providers for each covered service who must have substantial experience in providing that service to Medicaid enrollees and children eligible for medical assistance under Title XXI of the Social Security Act and who meet all agency standards and requirements. The contracts for program providers shall be awarded through a competitive procurement process. The contracts must be for 5 years and may not be renewed; however, the agency may extend the term of a plan contract to cover delays during a transition to a new plan provider. The agency shall include in the contracts a medical loss ratio provision
