23	Section 1. Section 1003.07, Florida Statutes, is created

26	(1) SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the "District
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27	School Board Educational Innovation and Home Rule Powers Act."
28	(2) LEGISLATIVE FINDINGSThe Legislature finds that:
29	(a) District school boards are charged with operating,
30	controlling, and supervising all free public schools within
31	their respective school districts pursuant to s. 4, Art. IX of
32	the State Constitution.
33	(b) The exercise of expanded local control and flexibility
34	by district school boards, which is currently exercised by
35	charter schools, will inspire school boards to initiate
36	educational innovation and implement financial efficiencies to
37	meet the needs of their respective students, parents, and
38	communities.
39	(c) The exercise of expanded home rule powers by locally
40	elected district school boards under this section will expand
41	educational innovation in public education for the academic and
42	economic betterment of all Floridians.
43	(3) DESIGNATIONA district school board that wishes to
44	independently govern its district in a manner that best suits
45	the needs of the students in its district may form a home rule
46	school district upon adoption of a rule pursuant to ss.
47	120.536(1) and 120.54 which implements and conforms to this
48	section. Upon adoption of the rule, the school district shall be
49	designated and referred to as a home rule school district for
50	the purposes of this section. A copy of the rule, and any
51	related amendments, must be provided to the Commissioner of
52	Education within 10 days after adoption by the district school
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53	board.
54	(4) EXEMPTIONS FROM STATUTESWith the exception of the
55	provisions identified in paragraph (a), and upon a determination
56	by a district school board, a home rule school district is
57	exempt from chapters 1000-1013, including any implementing rules
58	adopted by the State Board of Education and identified by
59	district rule.
60	(a) A home rule school district must comply with the
61	following provisions in chapters 1000-1013:
62	1. Those statutes specifically applying to home rule
63	school districts, including this section.
64	2. Those statutes pertaining to the student assessment
65	program and school grading system.
66	3. Those statutes pertaining to the provision of services
67	for students with disabilities.
68	4. Those statutes pertaining to civil rights, including s.
69	1000.05, relating to discrimination.
70	5. Those statutes pertaining to student health, safety,
71	and welfare.
72	(b) A home rule school district must also comply with the
73	following provisions:
74	1. Section 286.011, relating to public meetings and
75	records, public inspection, and criminal and civil penalties.
76	2. Chapter 119, relating to public records.
77	3. Section 1003.03, relating to maximum class size, except
78	that the calculation for compliance pursuant to s. 1003.03 must

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79	be at the average school level.
80	4. Section 1012.22(1)(c), relating to compensation and
81	salary schedules.
82	5. Section 1012.33(5), relating to workforce reductions.
83	6. Section 1012.335, relating to contracts with
84	instructional personnel hired on or after July 1, 2011.
85	7. Section 1012.34, relating to the substantive
86	requirements for performance evaluations for instructional
87	personnel and school administrators.
88	(c) Notwithstanding any other provision of law,
89	categorical funds identified in s. 1011.62 or any other
90	earmarked funds that are appropriated by the Legislature to a
91	home rule school district may be expended for a different
92	purpose as identified by the district school board.
93	(d) The district school board may determine the extent of
94	any exemption authorized under this section.
95	(5) ANNUAL REPORTThe superintendent of a home rule
96	school district shall annually provide a written report to the
97	district school board on the implementation and effectiveness of
98	the exemptions exercised under this section. The report shall
99	include any recommended amendments to the rule adopted pursuant
100	to subsection (3). The district school board shall conduct a
101	public hearing to review the annual report within 60 days after
102	receipt of the superintendent's written report. A copy of the
103	annual report shall be submitted to the commissioner within 10
104	days after the public hearing.

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105	Section 2. If any provision of this act or its application
106	to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity
107	does not affect other provisions or applications of the act
108	which can be given effect without the invalid provision or
109	application, and to this end the provisions of this act are
110	severable.
111	Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
