5	WHEREAS, the Federal Republic of Nigeria (Nigeria) is the
6	most populous country in Africa with more than 177 million
7	residents and is the seventh most populated nation in the world,
8	and
9	WHEREAS, Nigeria, Africa's largest democracy and economy,
10	is the world's twelfth largest producer of crude oil, and has
11	the world's tenth largest proven oil reserves, and
12	WHEREAS, Nigeria has more than 510 living languages, the
13	world's third largest collection of living languages, including
14	Hausa, Yoruba, Ijaw, Ibibio, Edo, Itsekiri, and Igbo, and
15	WHEREAS, brave Nigerians volunteered in the "forgotten
16	army" to fight with the 81st and 82nd West African Divisions of
17	the Allied Forces in World War II, served with distinction in
18	various peacekeeping forces, and have been widely recognized in
19	the international community as an unrelenting advocate of global
20	peace, and
21	WHEREAS, there are more than 266,000 Nigerians in the
22	United States, approximately 9,000 of whom reside in Florida,
23	and according to the United States Census Bureau's 2014 American
24	Community Survey, Nigerian immigrants in the United States are
25	well-educated, with approximately 96 percent of Nigerian
26	Americans surveyed between 2008 and 2012 having a minimum of a

27 high school education and approximately 61 percent having 28 obtained at least a bachelor's degree, and

29 WHEREAS, some notable Nigerians include Akinwande Oluwole 30 "Wole" Babatunde Soyinka, Africa's first winner of the Nobel 31 Prize in Literature; Hakeem Olajuwon, National Basketball 32 Association (NBA) Finals Most Valuable Player and a 12-time NBA 33 All-Star; Chinua Achebe, author of "Things Fall Apart," one of 34 the most widely read novels in modern African literature which 35 has been translated into more than 50 languages and has sold 36 more than 8 million copies worldwide; and Aliko Dangote, a 37 Nigerian billionaire who was ranked by Forbes Magazine as the 38 richest person of African descent, and

39 WHEREAS, the Nigerian-American community and the nonprofit 40 Nigerian American Foundation strive to increase awareness and 41 understanding of the Nigerian culture through education and 42 collaborative endeavors, such as the annual Nigerian Festival in 43 Miami Gardens which brings people together to enjoy traditional 44 Nigerian culture, music, and performances, NOW, THEREFORE,
