31	Section 2. It is the finding of the Legislature that it is
32	a public necessity that records, data, information, or reports
33	containing the name, address, other identifying data of the
34	respondent, petitioner, or recipient of firearms relinquished

36	Statutes, or records that contain the make, model, caliber,

This act shall take effect on the same date 56 that HB 925 or similar legislation relating to relinquishing 57 firearms pursuant to a domestic violence, stalking, or 58 cyberstalking injunction takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof 59 60 and becomes a law.
