2	An act relating to unmanned aircraft; creating s.
3	330.41, F.S.; providing a short title; providing
4	definitions; providing that the authority to regulate
5	the ownership or operation of unmanned aircraft
6	systems is vested in the state; prohibiting a
7	political subdivision from enacting or enforcing
8	certain ordinances or resolutions relating to unmanned
9	aircraft systems; providing construction; requiring
10	persons seeking to restrict or limit the operation of
11	unmanned aircraft in close proximity to certain
12	infrastructure or facilities to apply to the Federal
13	Aviation Administration; prohibiting certain operation
14	of an unmanned aircraft in relation to certain
15	critical infrastructure facilities; providing
16	penalties; providing exceptions; creating s. 330.411,
17	F.S.; prohibiting possession or operation of an
18	unmanned aircraft or unmanned aircraft system with
19	certain attached weapons or devices; providing
20	penalties; amending s. 934.50, F.S.; exempting a
21	communications services provider and its contractor
22	from certain prohibitions against the use of a drone;
23	providing an effective date.

25	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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27	Section 1. Section 330.41, Florida Statutes, is created to
28	read:
29	330.41 Unmanned Aircraft Systems Act
30	(1) SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the "Unmanned
31	Aircraft Systems Act."
32	(2) DEFINITIONSAs used in this act, the term:
33	(a) "Critical infrastructure facility" means any of the
34	following, if completely enclosed by a fence or other physical
35	barrier that is obviously designed to exclude intruders, or if
36	clearly marked with a sign or signs which indicate that entry is
37	forbidden and which are posted on the property in a manner
38	reasonably likely to come to the attention of intruders:
39	1. An electrical power generation or transmission
40	facility, substation, switching station, or control center.
41	2. A natural gas or compressed gas compressor station,
42	storage facility, or pipeline.
43	3. A liquid natural gas or propane gas terminal or storage
44	facility.
45	4. Any portion of an aboveground oil or gas pipeline.
46	5. A wireless communications facility, including towers,
47	antennae, support structures, and all associated ground-based
48	equipment.
49	6. A chemical or rubber manufacturing or storage facility.
50	7. A mining facility.

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51	(b) "Person" means an individual, partnership,
52	corporation, association, governmental entity, or other legal
53	entity.
54	(c) "Unmanned aircraft" means a drone as defined in s.
55	934.50(2).
56	(d) "Unmanned aircraft system" means an unmanned aircraft
57	and associated elements, including communication links and the
58	components used to control the unmanned aircraft which are
59	required for the pilot in command to operate the unmanned
60	aircraft safely and efficiently.
61	(3) REGULATION.—
62	(a) The authority to regulate the ownership or operation
63	of unmanned aircraft systems is vested in the state.
64	(b) Except as otherwise expressly provided in this
65	section, a political subdivision may not enact or enforce an
66	ordinance or resolution relating to the design, manufacture,
67	testing, maintenance, licensing, registration, certification, or
68	operation of an unmanned aircraft system, including airspace,
69	altitude, flight paths, and equipment or technology
70	requirements; purpose of operations; and pilot, operator, or
71	observer qualifications, training, and certification.
72	(c) This section does not limit local government authority
73	to enact or enforce local ordinances relating to nuisances,
74	voyeurism, harassment, reckless endangerment, property damage,
75	or other illegal acts arising from the use of unmanned aircraft
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76	systems if such ordinances are not specifically related to the
77	use of an unmanned aircraft system for those illegal acts.
78	(d) This section shall be construed in accordance with
79	standards described by federal statutes and regulations and
80	Federal Aviation Administration guidance on unmanned aircraft
81	systems.
82	(4) PROTECTION OF INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES
83	(a) A person seeking to restrict or limit the operation of
84	unmanned aircraft in close proximity to infrastructure or
85	facilities the person owns or operates must apply to the Federal
86	Aviation Administration for such designation pursuant to section
87	2209 of the FAA Extension, Safety, and Security Act of 2016.
88	(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), a person may not
89	knowingly or willfully:
90	1. Operate an unmanned aircraft over a critical
91	infrastructure facility;
92	2. Allow an unmanned aircraft to make contact with a
93	critical infrastructure facility, including any person or object
94	on the premises of or within the facility; or
95	3. Allow an unmanned aircraft to come within a distance of
96	a critical infrastructure facility that is close enough to
97	interfere with the operations of or cause a disturbance to the
98	facility.
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100	A person who violates this paragraph commits a misdemeanor of
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101	the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s.
102	775.083. A person who commits a second or subsequent violation
103	commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as
104	provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
105	(c) This section does not apply to actions described in
106	paragraph (b) that are committed by:
107	1. A federal, state, or other governmental entity or a
108	person under contract with or otherwise acting under the
109	direction of such entity.
110	2. A law enforcement agency that is in compliance with s.
111	934.50 or a person under contract with or otherwise acting under
112	the direction of such law enforcement agency.
113	3. An owner, operator, or occupant of the critical
114	infrastructure facility or a person who has prior written
115	consent of such owner, operator, or occupant.
116	(d) Subparagraph (b)1. does not apply to an unmanned
117	aircraft operating in transit for commercial purposes in
118	compliance with Federal Aviation Administration regulations,
119	authorizations, or exemptions.
120	Section 2. Section 330.411, Florida Statutes, is created
121	to read:
122	330.411 Prohibited possession or operation of unmanned
123	aircraft; penalties.—A person may not possess or operate an
124	unmanned aircraft or unmanned aircraft system as defined in s.
125	330.41 with an attached weapon, firearm, explosive, destructive

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126	device, or ammunition as defined in s. 790.001. Notwithstanding
127	s. 330.33, a person who violates this section commits a
128	misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s.
129	<u>775.082 or s. 775.083.</u>
130	Section 3. Paragraph (j) is added to subsection (4) of
131	section 934.50, Florida Statutes, to read:
132	934.50 Searches and seizure using a drone
133	(4) EXCEPTIONSThis section does not prohibit the use of
134	a drone:
135	(j) By a communications services provider or its
136	contractor for routing, siting, installation, maintenance, or
137	inspection of facilities used to provide communications
138	services.
139	Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2017.
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
