1 2 An act relating to the Ocean Highway and Port 3 Authority, Nassau County; amending ch. 2005-293, Laws of Florida; updating authority powers consistent with 4 5 ch. 311, Florida Statutes; deleting obsolete language; 6 providing an effective date. 7 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 9 Subsections (2) and (6) of section 7, 10 Section 1. subsection (2) of section 30, and sections 31, 34, and 35 of 11 12 section 3 of chapter 2005-293, Laws of Florida, as amended, are 13 amended to read: 14 Section 7. Specific powers.-The authority shall have the following powers, in addition to all other powers conferred by 15 this act: 16 17 (2)To lay out, construct, condemn, purchase, own, 18 acquire, add to, extend, enlarge, maintain, conduct, operate, 19 build, equip, manage, furnish, replace, enlarge, improve, lease, 20 sell, regulate, finance, control, repair, and establish office 21 and administrative buildings to be used and occupied in whole or in part by the authority, wharves, docks, slips, channels, 22 jetties, piers, quays, terminals, sidings, shipyards, marine 23 railways, terminal facilities, harbors, ports, waterways, moles, 24 25 canals, cold storage plants, terminal icing plants,

26 refrigerating plants, precooling plants, locks, tidal basins, 27 trainways, cableways, anchorage areas, depots, warehouses, 28 industrial parks, industrial and manufacturing plants, 29 commercial, business, residential, mercantile, and other related 30 projects, motels, conveyors, appliances for economical handling, storage, and transportation of freight and the handling of 31 32 passenger traffic, and all other harbor improvements and 33 facilities which by resolution the board of commissioners may determine to be necessary; to create, construct, extend, 34 enlarge, establish, improve, and maintain transportation 35 facilities as provided in s. 311.07(3)(b)8., Florida Statutes, 36 37 intermodal facilities and intermodal facilities infrastructure as provided in ss. 311.07(3)(b)9. and 311.101, Florida Statutes, 38 39 and a freight logistics zone and an intermodal logistics center, as provided in ss. 311.103 and 311.101, Florida Statutes; and to 40 41 perform all customary services, including the handling, 42 weighing, measuring, regulation, control, inspection, and 43 reconditioning of all commodities and cargoes received or 44 shipped through any port or harbor within the jurisdiction of 45 the authority.

51 causeways, bridges, and other transportation facilities within 52 Nassau County, extending beyond Nassau County, or extending to 53 or into the State of Georgia and may avail of any applicable 54 federal law with respect to any such roads, ferries, streets, 55 alleys, parks, boulevards, viaducts, tunnels, causeways, 56 bridges, and other transportation facilities in the construction 57 and operation thereof and the charging of tolls and fees for the 58 services and facilities thereof; to lay out, construct, condemn, 59 purchase, own, acquire, add to, maintain, conduct, operate, 60 build, equip, manage, replace, enlarge, improve, regulate, control, repair, and establish educational and research 61 62 facilities, including, but not limited to, those devoted to marine construction and marine science, navigation, and 63 64 propulsion; hydroponics, aquaculture, and mariculture; 65 agriculture and silviculture; and transportation, logistics, and 66 supply chain management; hotels; and τ radio stations; to create, 67 construct, extend, enlarge, establish, erect, install, and 68 maintain any and all manner of cable, communication, cellular 69 telephone, fiber-optic, microwave, and other data and 70 information transmission facilities and their transmission equipment, including any cable, conduit, line, wire, or other 71 72 means necessary for the transmission of high-speed data, signal, 73 voice internet, and all other utility and telecommunication 74 services, and any and all recreational facilities, including 75 yacht basins, docks, piers, wharves, fishing piers, public

76 beaches, beach casinos, cabanas, pavilions, entertainment and 77 eating places, swimming pools, bath houses, stadiums, athletic 78 fields, parks, concert halls, auditoriums, golf courses, 79 playgrounds, parking lots, gardens, conservatories, and all 80 necessary or convenient appurtenances to any or all of same; and 81 to lay out, construct, condemn, purchase, own, acquire, add to, 82 maintain, conduct, operate, build, equip, manage, extend, 83 replace, enlarge, improve, regulate, control, repair, and establish any works or property, real or personal, for supplying 84 85 public utility services, including electricity, gas, water, sewer, and local transportation, and the generation of 86 87 electricity from all sources, including, but not limited to, solar panels and solar energy from all sources, wind energy from 88 89 all sources, including turbines and windmills, and hydroelectric 90 power through collection of kinetic energy from the ebb and flow of tides, within and without Nassau County or in Baker County or 91 92 Duval County, and to use the streets, roads, avenues, and other 93 public places in connection therewith, provided that no such 94 utility properties shall be acquired, constructed, owned, 95 operated, or maintained by such port authority within the limits 96 of any incorporated city or town unless and until the governing body of such city or town shall have by appropriate ordinance 97 consented thereto. The authority is hereby authorized and 98 empowered to establish, charge, and collect necessary and 99 100 reasonable fees, admissions, tolls, rates, rentals, and charges

for any or all of the services or facilities of any works, 101 102 undertakings, or properties. The authority is authorized to 103 finance the cost of any such project, in whole or in part, from 104 the proceeds of revenue obligations issued pursuant to this act. 105 Section 30. Organic oil refineries refinery; acquisition 106 and construction.-It is determined and declared that: 107 (2) The acquisition, construction, and equipping by the authority of an oil refinery and related facilities for the 108 refinement of organic oils of any kind, including fish oils, 109 pine oils, and tung oils, to be leased for operation to a 110 private corporation are in part a discharge of such 111 112 responsibility and constitute a public purpose for the financing of which revenue obligations of the port authority may be 113 issued. This shall not include any authority to construct a 114 115 petroleum refinery. Section 31. Authorization.-The authority is authorized to 116 117 acquire, construct, and equip an organic oil refinery and related facilities, including, but not limited to, buildings, 118 119 site improvements, fixtures, machinery, and equipment. Section 34. Toll road; authority to construct.-The 120 121 authority shall have power to construct any a toll road or other 122 transportation infrastructure or intermodal facility in from a point or points in the City of Fernandina Beach, Nassau County, 123 124 or as the southeastern terminus and from a point or points within 1 mile northerly of the intersection of U.S. Highway 125

131	Section 35. Sale of bonds authorized.— <u>Any</u> Such toll road,
132	or other transportation infrastructure or intermodal facility
133	referred to in this charter section 34, or any part or parts
134	thereof, may be constructed and financed by the Ocean Highway
135	and Port Authority in the manner provided in this act, and other
136	statutes relating to the authority. It is the express intention
137	of this section that the authority may construct and finance the
138	toll road <u>or other transportation infrastructure or intermodal</u>
139	facility in its entirety at the general locations referred to in
140	section 34, or any part or parts thereof, either at one time or
141	separately from time to time, and that the exact locations of
142	the routes and termini of the toll road <u>or other transportation</u>
143	infrastructure or intermodal facility, or any part or parts
144	thereof, shall be determined in the administrative discretion of
145	the authority, and that such determination of such exact routes
146	and termini shall not be required prior to the authorization,
147	validation, or sale of any bonds or other obligations issued by
