**Amendment**

Remove lines 242-252 and insert:

7 3.a. Identifying paint marks conspicuously painted on  
8 trees or posts provided that the paint marks are:

9 (I) Painted in an international orange color as a vertical  
10 line not less than 8 inches in length and not less than 1 inch  
11 in width;

12 (II) Placed so that the bottom of the paint mark is not  
13 less than 3 feet from the ground or more than 5 feet from the  
14 ground; and

15 (III) Placed in a manner and in such a position as to be  
16 clearly noticeable from outside the boundary line to any person

17 approaching the property and no more than 100 feet apart on  
18 agricultural land.

19 b. When a landowner uses identifying paint marks on trees  
20 or posts to identify a "no trespassing" area, the landowner must  
21 also place signs conspicuously at all places where entry to the  
22 property is normally expected or known to occur, upon which  
23 there appears prominently, in letters of not less than 2 inches  
24 in height, the words "No Trespassing" and in addition thereto  
25 the name of the owner, lessee, or occupant of the land.
