Paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 28 320.08053, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 29 320.08053 Establishment of Requirements for requests to 30 establish specialty license plates.-31 (2) 32 (b) Within 24 months after the presale specialty license 33 plate voucher is established, the approved specialty license 34 plate organization must record with the department a minimum of 35 4,000 1,000 voucher sales before manufacture of the license plate may begin commence. In determining 213 214 compliance, the department may commission an independent 215 actuarial consultant, or an independent certified public accountant, who has expertise in nonprofit and charitable 216 217 organizations.

(b) The department must discontinue the distribution of revenues to any organization failing to submit the required documentation as required in subsection (1), but may resume distribution of the revenues upon receipt of the required information.

(c) If the department or its designee determines that an organization has not complied or has failed to use the revenues in accordance with ss. 320.08056 and 320.08058, the department

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must discontinue the distribution of the revenues to the 226 227 organization. The department shall notify the organization of 228 its findings and direct the organization to make the changes 229 necessary in order to comply with this chapter. If the officers 230 of the organization sign an affidavit under penalties of perjury 231 stating that they acknowledge the findings of the department and 232 attest that they have taken corrective action and that the 233 organization will submit to a followup review by the department, 234 the department may resume the distribution of revenues.

235 (d) If an organization fails to comply with the 236 department's recommendations and corrective actions as outlined 237 in paragraph (c), the revenue distributions shall be 238 discontinued until completion of the next regular session of the 239 Legislature. The department shall notify the President of the 240 Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by the first day of the next regular session of any organization whose 241 242 revenues have been withheld as a result of this paragraph. If 243 the Legislature does not provide direction to the organization 244 and the department regarding the status of the undistributed 245 revenues, the department shall deauthorize the plate and the 246 undistributed revenues shall be immediately deposited into the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund. 247

(3) The department or its designee has the authority to
examine all records pertaining to the use of funds from the sale
of specialty license plates.

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251 Section 6. By January 1, 2018, the Department of Highway 252 Safety and Motor Vehicles shall report to the Governor, the 253 President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of 254 Representatives the total cost per unit of producing each 255 specialty license plate listed in s. 320.08056(4), Florida 256 Statutes. The cost per unit shall include the cost per license 257 plate, including the cost of the physical license plate, 258 stamping costs, and the cost associated with inventorying the 259 license plate. The report shall also provide a calculation of 260 the break-even point in number of plates for each specialty 261 license plate. 262 Section 7. (1) The Department of Highway Safety and Motor 263 Vehicles shall review and make preparations for the transition 264 from the existing process of creating specialty license plates 265 to using a new template design that is readily recognizable by 266 applying to a standard license plate an appropriate logo or 267 graphic that identifies the specialty license plate. New 268 specialty license plates must be of the same size and design as 269 a standard license plate issued by the department, with a 270 designated area for including a unique design and identifying 271 number. 272 Upon completion of the review, the department may (2) 273 begin the process of transitioning by attrition to the new 274 specialty license plate template design. 275 Section 8.
