- (2) STATEWIDE CANNABIS AND MARIJUANA EDUCATION CAMPAIGN.-
- (a) The department shall develop educational materials to educate caregivers, including, but not limited to, physicians licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459, licensed practical nurses, registered nurses, hospice workers, persons who provide palliative care, and hospice caregivers to provide to qualified patients accurate information about cannabis and marijuana as set forth in s. 29, Art. X of the State Constitution, s. 381.986, and this section. The information may include:

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- 1. The legal requirements for its use and possession of marijuana in this state.
- 2. Safe use of marijuana, including preventing access by persons other than qualified patients as defined in s. 381.986.
- 3. Other cannabis-related and marijuana-related education determined by the department to be necessary to inform caregivers so they may provide to qualified patients the most accurate information on its use as authorized by constitution and law.
- (b) The department may use television messaging, radio broadcasts, print media, digital strategies, social media, and any other form of messaging deemed necessary and appropriate by the department to implement the education campaign. The department may work with private and public hospitals, hospice providers, health and disease organizations, and other appropriate entities to provide training and programming.
- (c) The department may contract with one or more vendors to implement the campaign.
- (d) The department shall contract with an independent entity to conduct annual evaluations of the campaign. The evaluations shall assess the reach and impact of the campaign, success in educating caregivers regarding the legal parameters for marijuana use. For the first year of the campaign, the evaluator shall conduct surveys to establish baseline data on use of medical cannabis and marijuana by qualified patients, the
