A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Florida College System Minority Need-Based Grant Program; creating s. 1009.895, F.S.; creating the grant program within the Department of Education; requiring the Office of Student Financial Assistance to administer the program; providing the purpose of the program and student eligibility requirements; specifying funding and a funding priority; providing the renewal requirements for the grant awards; providing rulemaking; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1009.895, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

1009.895 Florida College System Minority Need-Based Grant Program.—Beginning with the 2017-2018 school year, the Florida College System (FCS) Minority Need-Based Grant Program is created within the Department of Education. The grant program shall be administered by the Office of Student Financial Assistance.

- (1) PURPOSE.—The purpose of the FCS Minority Need-Based

 Grant Program is to provide educational opportunities to

 African-American, Hispanic-American, Asian-American, and Native

 American disadvantaged students enrolled in science, technology,

 engineering, and math (STEM) programs in this state and who

 demonstrate a financial need.
 - (2) STUDENT ELIGIBILITY.—To be eligible for an award under

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the grant program, a student must meet all of the following requirements:

- (a) Be a state resident, as determined in s. 1009.40 and rules of the State Board of Education.
- (b) Earn a standard Florida high school diploma or its equivalent pursuant to s. 1002.3105, s. 1003.4281, s. 1003.4282, or s. 1003.435 unless:
- 1. The student completes a home education program according to s. 1002.41; or
- 2. The student earns a high school diploma from a non-Florida school while living with a parent or guardian who is on a military or public service assignment out of this state.
- (c) Be accepted by and enrolled in an eligible FCS institution.
- (d) Be enrolled for at least 6 semester credit hours or the equivalent in quarter hours or clock hours in a STEM program.
- (e) Not have been found guilty of, or have entered a plea of nolo contendere to, a felony charge, unless the student has been granted clemency by the Governor and Cabinet sitting as the Executive Office of Clemency.
 - (f) Apply for, and be awarded, Pell Grant funds.
- (h) Demonstrate readiness for postsecondary education by earning a passing score on the College Placement Test or its equivalent, as identified by the department.
 - (i) Achieve a 2.75-3.00 weighted grade point average (GPA).
- $\underline{\mbox{(j)}}$ Achieve a minimum score of 970 on the SAT or 20 on the ACT.

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(3) FUNDING.—Funding for the grant program shall be as provided in the General Appropriations Act. Seventy percent of the funds must be provided to African-American students.

- (4) AWARD RENEWAL.—To be eligible to renew an award under the grant program, a student must maintain the equivalent of a 2.75 cumulative GPA or higher and earn at least 6 credit hours for each semester funded.
- (5) RULES.—The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to implement this section.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2017.
