WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is the sixth leading cause of death in the United States, killing more people than breast cancer and prostate cancer combined, and

WHEREAS, 5.4 million Americans are living with Alzheimer's disease, the vast majority of whom are 65 years of age and older, and

WHEREAS, the Alzheimer's Association reports Florida had the second highest prevalence rate of Alzheimer's disease in the nation in 2016, with more than 510,000 Floridians living with the disease and that number expected to rise to 720,000 by 2025, and

WHEREAS, the Alzheimer's Association projects that, in the absence of the development of medical interventions to prevent or cure the disease, the number of Americans living with Alzheimer's disease will nearly triple by 2050, and

WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is the only disease among the top 10 causes of death in the nation which cannot be prevented, cured, or slowed, and

WHEREAS, in 2015, family members and friends for each person living with Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia collectively provided 18.1 billion hours of unpaid care to all such patients, and approximately two-thirds of these caregivers were women and more than one-third were 65 years of age or older, and

WHEREAS, the Alzheimer's Association reports that Alzheimer's disease is one of the costliest chronic diseases, with total payments nationally for health care, long-term care, and hospice estimated at \$236 billion in 2016, and

WHEREAS, nationwide, nearly one in five Medicare dollars is spent on people living with Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia, and by 2050 that ratio is expected to increase to one in every three dollars, with total costs rising to more than \$1 trillion, and

WHEREAS, the Alzheimer's Association estimates that in 2016 the cost to Florida's Medicaid program to care for people with Alzheimer's disease was \$2.336 million, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida:

That June 18-24, 2017, is recognized as "Alzheimer's Disease and Dementia Awareness Week" in Florida.
