From the funds in Specific Appropriation 66B, \$1,691,010 in recurring appropriations project funds and \$808,990 in nonrecurring appropriations project funds (Senate Form 1803) shall be used to support Florida residents who are enrolled in the Osteopathic Medicine or the Pharmacy Program at the Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine/Bradenton. The college shall submit enrollment information for Florida residents to the Department of Education prior to January 1, 2018."

GOVERNOR'S VETO MESSAGE

"The [indicated project following Specific Appropriation 66B] is vetoed because the institution increased tuition from Fiscal Year 2016-17 to Fiscal Year 2017-18 by 2 percent for the Osteopathic Medicine and Pharmacy Programs.

ANALYST COMMENT

This appropriation provided \$2,500,000 in general revenue (\$1,691,010 recurring; \$808,990 nonrecurring) to Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine/Bradenton to support Florida residents who are enrolled in the Osteopathic Medicine or Pharmacy Program.
