Perform under the protocol procedures commonly used to 35 render the patient insensible to pain during the performance of surgical, obstetrical, therapeutic, or diagnostic clinical 36 procedures. These procedures include ordering and administering 37 regional, spinal, and general anesthesia; inhalation agents and 38 39 techniques; intravenous agents and techniques; and techniques of 40 hypnosis. 5. Order or perform monitoring procedures indicated as 41 42 pertinent to the anesthetic health care management of the 43 patient. 44 6. Support life functions during anesthesia health care, 45 including induction and intubation procedures, the use of 46 appropriate mechanical supportive devices, and the management of fluid, electrolyte, and blood component balances. 47 7. Recognize and take appropriate corrective action for 48 49 abnormal patient responses to anesthesia, adjunctive medication, 50 or other forms of therapy. 51 8.
