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An act relating to health insurance coverage for enteral formulas; amending s. 627.42395, F.S.; deleting the annual coverage limit and age limit for coverage of certain food products for the treatment of certain diseases; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 627.42395, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

627.42395 Coverage for certain prescription and nonprescription enteral formulas. - Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a any health insurance policy delivered or issued for delivery τ to a $\frac{\partial u}{\partial t}$ person in this state or a $\frac{\partial u}{\partial t}$ group, blanket, or franchise health insurance policy delivered or issued for delivery in this state must shall make available to the policyholder as part of the application, for an appropriate additional premium, coverage for prescription and nonprescription enteral formulas for home use which are physician prescribed as medically necessary for the treatment of inherited diseases of amino acid, organic acid, carbohydrate, or fat metabolism as well as malabsorption originating from congenital defects present at birth or acquired during the neonatal period. Coverage for inherited diseases of amino acids and organic acids must shall include food products modified to be low protein, in an amount not to exceed \$2,500 annually for any insured individual, through the age of 24. This section applies to any person or family notwithstanding the existence of any preexisting condition.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2017.
