Such 16 designation is valid for a 4-year period. 17 (2) (a) The division may impose a fee, not to exceed \$50, 18 for a Firefighter Emeritus designation or for renewal of the 19 designation. 20 The division may provide for a different fee if the 21 status is requested by a fire service instructor I, II, or III, 22 or firesafety inspector certified pursuant to chapter 633. (3) A Firefighter Emeritus who, after separation from 23 employment, returns to active status under s. 633.414(4) must 24 25 pay any licensure fees and satisfy all continuing education

- (4) A Firefighter Emeritus may not engage in firefighting activities with a fire department unless he or she holds a current and valid Firefighter Certificate of Compliance or Special Certificate of Compliance issued by the division under s. 633.408.
- (5) A Firefighter Emeritus shall apply for renewal of his or her designation as a Firefighter Emeritus on a form prescribed by the division. A Firefighter Emeritus who does not renew his or her designation before the end of the 4-year period is subject to a \$50 administrative fee.
- (6) The division shall adopt rules to administer this section.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2017.
