Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

Section 1. Section 320.08053, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

320.08053 Establishment of Requirements for requests to establish specialty license plates.-

(1) If a specialty license plate requested by an organization is approved by law, the organization must submit

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the proposed art design for the specialty license plate to the department, in a medium prescribed by the department, as soon as practicable, but no later than 60 days after the act approving the specialty license plate becomes a law.

- (2)(a) Within 120 days following the specialty license plate becoming law, the department shall establish a method to issue a specialty license plate voucher to allow for the presale of the specialty license plate. The processing fee as prescribed in s. 320.08056, the service charge and branch fee as prescribed in s. 320.04, and the annual use fee as prescribed in s. 320.08056 shall be charged for the voucher. All other applicable fees shall be charged at the time of issuance of the license plates.
- (b) Within 24 months after the presale specialty license plate voucher is established, the approved specialty license plate organization must record with the department a minimum of $3,000 \frac{1,000}{1}$ voucher sales before manufacture of the license plate may begin commence. If, at the conclusion of the 24-month presale period, the minimum sales requirement has requirements have not been met, the specialty plate is deauthorized and the department shall discontinue development of the plate and discontinue issuance of the presale vouchers. Upon deauthorization of the license plate, a purchaser of the license plate voucher may use the annual use fee collected as a credit towards any other specialty license plate or apply for a refund on a form prescribed by the department.
- (3) (a) If the Legislature has approved 125 or more specialty license plates, the department may not make any new specialty license plates available for design, presale, or

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issuance until a sufficient number of plates are discontinued pursuant to s. 320.08056(8) such that the number of plates being issued is reduced to fewer than 125.

(b) New specialty license plates that have been approved by law but are awaiting issuance under paragraph (a) shall be issued in the order they appear in s. 320.08056(4). All other provisions of this section must also be met before a plate is issued.

Section 2. Present paragraphs (ff) through (ddd), present paragraphs (fff) through (ppp), present paragraphs (sss) through (eeee) of subsection (4) of section 320.08056, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as paragraphs (ee) through (ccc), paragraphs (ddd) through (nnn), and paragraphs (ooo) through (aaaa), respectively, and present paragraphs (ee), (eee), (qqq), and (rrr) of that subsection are amended, and new paragraphs (bbbb) through (eeee) and paragraphs (ffff) through (bbbbb) are added to that subsection, to read:

320.08056 Specialty license plates.

(4) The following license plate annual use fees shall be collected for the appropriate specialty license plates:

(ee) American Red Cross license plate, \$25.

(eee) Donate Organs-Pass It On license plate, \$25.

(qqq) St. Johns River license plate, \$25.

(rrr) Hispanic Achievers license plate, \$25.

(bbbb) Ducks Unlimited license plate, \$25.

(dddd) America the Beautiful license plate, \$25.

(eeee) Protect Pollinators plate, \$25.

93	(c) A person issued a specialty license plate that has been		
94	discontinued by the department may keep the discontinued		
95	specialty license plate for the remainder of the 10-year license		
96	plate replacement period and must pay all other applicable		
97	registration fees. However, such person is exempt from paying		

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the applicable specialty license plate fee under subsection (4) for the remainder of the 10-year license plate replacement period.

- (d) If the department discontinues issuance of a specialty license plate, all annual use fees held or collected by the department shall be distributed within 180 days after the date the specialty license plate is discontinued. Of those fees, the department shall retain an amount sufficient to defray the applicable administrative and inventory closeout costs associated with discontinuance of the plate. The remaining funds shall be distributed to the specified organization or organizations as provided in s. 320.08058.
- (e) If an organization that is the intended recipient of the funds pursuant to s. 320.08058 no longer exists, the department shall deposit any undisbursed funds into the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund.
- (f) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), on January 1 of each year, the department shall discontinue the specialty license plate with the fewest number of plates in circulation over the previous 24 months. A warning letter shall be mailed to the sponsoring organization following the first month in which the total number of valid specialty license plate registrations is the fewest in circulation over the previous 24 months.
- (10)(a) A specialty license plate annual use fee collected and distributed under this chapter, or any interest earned from those fees, may not be used for commercial or for-profit activities nor for general or administrative expenses, except as authorized by s. 320.08058 or to pay the cost of the audit or report required by s. 320.08062(1). The fees and any interest

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earned from the fees may be expended only for use in this state unless the annual use fee is derived from the sale of United States Armed Forces and veterans-related specialty license plates pursuant to paragraphs (4)(d), (bb), (kk), (iii), and (uuu) $\frac{\text{(11), (kkk), and (yyy)}}{\text{(uuu)}}$ and s. 320.0891 or out-of-state college or university license plates pursuant to paragraphs (4) (wwww) and (bbbbb).

Section 3. Effective October 1, 2020, paragraph (a) of subsection (8) of section 320.08056, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

320.08056 Specialty license plates.-

(8) (a) The department must discontinue the issuance of an approved specialty license plate if the number of valid specialty plate registrations falls below 3,000 1,000 plates for at least 12 consecutive months. A warning letter shall be mailed to the sponsoring organization following the first month in which the total number of valid specialty plate registrations is below $3,000 \frac{1,000 \text{ plates}}{1,000 \text{ plates}}$. This paragraph does not apply to collegiate license plates established under s. 320.08058(3), license plates of institutions in and entities of the State University System, specialty license plates that have statutory eligibility limitations for purchase, or Florida Professional Sports Team License plates established under s. 320.08058(9).

Section 4. Present subsections (32) through (56), present subsections (58) through (68), and present subsections (71) through (83) of section 320.08058, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as subsections (31) through (55), subsections (56) through (66), and (67) through (79), respectively, paragraph (a) of subsection (7), present subsections (31) and (57), paragraph

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(b) of present subsection (66), present subsections (69) and (70), and paragraph (b) of present subsection (80) of that section are amended, and new subsections (80) through (83) and subsections (84) through (106) are added to that section, to read:

320.08058 Specialty license plates.-

- (7) SPECIAL OLYMPICS FLORIDA LICENSE PLATES.-
- (a) Special Olympics Florida license plates must contain the official Special Olympics Florida logo and must bear a design and colors that are approved by the department. The word "Florida" must be centered at the top bottom of the plate, and the words "Be a Fan" "Everyone Wins" must be centered at the bottom top of the plate.
 - (31) AMERICAN RED CROSS LICENSE PLATES.-
- (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 320.08053, the department shall develop an American Red Cross license plate as provided in this section. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "American Red Cross" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
- (b) The department shall retain all revenues from the sale of such plates until all startup costs for developing and issuing the plates have been recovered. Thereafter, 50 percent of the annual use fees shall be distributed to the American Red Cross Chapter of Central Florida, with statistics on sales of license plates, which are tabulated by county. The American Red Cross Chapter of Central Florida must distribute to each of the chapters in this state the moneys received from sales in the counties covered by the respective chapters, which moneys must be used for education and disaster relief in Florida. Fifty

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percent of the annual use fees shall be distributed proportionately to the three statewide approved poison control centers for purposes of combating bioterrorism and other poisonrelated purposes.

(57) DONATE ORGANS-PASS IT ON LICENSE PLATES.-

- (a) The department shall develop a Donate Organs-Pass It On license plate as provided in this section. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Donate Organs-Pass It On" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
- (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to Transplant Foundation, Inc., and shall use up to 10 percent of the proceeds from the annual use fee for marketing and administrative costs that are directly associated with the management and distribution of the proceeds. The remaining proceeds shall be used to provide statewide grants for patient services, including preoperative, rehabilitative, and housing assistance; organ donor education and awareness programs; and statewide medical research.
 - (64) (66) IN GOD WE TRUST LICENSE PLATES.-
- (b) The license plate annual use fees shall be distributed to the In God We Trust Foundation, Inc., which may use up to 10 percent of the proceeds to offset administrative costs, promotion, and marketing of the license plate directly associated with the operations of the foundation. The remaining proceeds may be used to address the needs of the military community and the public safety community; provide educational grants and scholarships to foster self-reliance and stability in Florida's youth; and provide education in to fund educational scholarships for the children of Florida residents who are

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members of the United States Armed Forces, the National Guard, and the United States Armed Forces Reserve and for the children of public safety employees who have died in the line of duty who are not covered by existing state law. Funds shall also be distributed to other s. 501(c)(3) organizations that may apply for grants and scholarships and to provide educational grants to public and private schools regarding to promote the historical and religious significance of religion in American and Florida history. The In God We Trust Foundation, Inc., shall create an advisory council comprised of persons with knowledge in these program areas to make funding recommendations distribute the license plate annual use fees in the following manner:

1. The In God We Trust Foundation, Inc., shall retain all revenues from the sale of such plates until all startup costs for developing and establishing the plate have been recovered.

2. Ten percent of the funds received by the In God We Trust Foundation, Inc., shall be expended for administrative costs, promotion, and marketing of the license plate directly associated with the operations of the In God We Trust Foundation, Inc.

3. All remaining funds shall be expended by the In God We Trust Foundation, Inc., for programs.

(69) ST. JOHNS RIVER LICENSE PLATES.

(a) The department shall develop a St. Johns River license plate as provided in this section. The St. Johns River license plates must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "St. Johns River" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

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(b) The requirements of s. 320.08053 must be met prior to the issuance of the plate. Thereafter, the license plate annual use fees shall be distributed to the St. Johns River Alliance, Inc., a s. 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, which shall administer the fees as follows:

1. The St. Johns River Alliance, Inc., shall retain the first \$60,000 of the annual use fees as direct reimbursement for administrative costs, startup costs, and costs incurred in the development and approval process. Thereafter, up to 10 percent of the annual use fee revenue may be used for administrative costs directly associated with education programs, conservation, research, and grant administration of the organization, and up to 10 percent may be used for promotion and marketing of the specialty license plate.

2. At least 30 percent of the fees shall be available for competitive grants for targeted community-based or county-based research or projects for which state funding is limited or not currently available. The remaining 50 percent shall be directed toward community outreach and access programs. The competitive grants shall be administered and approved by the board of directors of the St. Johns River Alliance, Inc. A grant advisory committee shall be composed of six members chosen by the St. Johns River Alliance board members.

3. Any remaining funds shall be distributed with the approval of and accountability to the board of directors of the St. Johns River Alliance, Inc., and shall be used to support activities contributing to education, outreach, and springs conservation.

4. Effective July 1, 2014, the St. Johns River license

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plate will shift into the presale voucher phase, as provided in s. 320.08053(2)(b). The St. Johns River Alliance, Inc., shall have 24 months to record a minimum of 1,000 sales of the license plates. Sales include existing active plates and vouchers sold subsequent to July 1, 2014. During the voucher period, new plates may not be issued, but existing plates may be renewed. If, at the conclusion of the 24-month presale period, the requirement of a minimum of 1,000 sales has been met, the department shall resume normal distribution of the St. Johns River specialty plate. If, after 24 months, the minimum of 1,000 sales has not been met, the department shall discontinue the development and issuance of the plate. This subparagraph is repealed June 30, 2016.

(70) HISPANIC ACHIEVERS LICENSE PLATES.-

(a) Notwithstanding the requirements of s. 320.08053, the department shall develop a Hispanic Achievers license plate as provided in this section. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Hispanic Achievers" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

(b) The proceeds from the license plate annual use fee shall be distributed to National Hispanic Corporate Achievers, Inc., a nonprofit corporation under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, to fund grants to nonprofit organizations to operate programs and provide scholarships and for marketing the Hispanic Achievers license plate. National Hispanic Corporate Achievers, Inc., shall establish a Hispanic Achievers Grant Council that shall provide recommendations for statewide grants from available Hispanic Achievers license plate proceeds to

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nonprofit organizations for programs and scholarships for Hispanic and minority Floridians. National Hispanic Corporate Achievers, Inc., shall also establish a Hispanic Achievers License Plate Fund. Moneys in the fund shall be used by the grant council as provided in this paragraph. All funds received under this subsection must be used in this state. (c) National Hispanic Corporate Achievers, Inc., may retain all proceeds from the annual use fee until documented startup

- costs for developing and establishing the plate have been recovered. Thereafter, the proceeds from the annual use fee shall be used as follows:
- 1. Up to 5 percent of the proceeds may be used for the cost of administration of the Hispanic Achievers License Plate Fund, the Hispanic Achievers Grant Council, and related matters.
- 2. Funds may be used as necessary for annual audit or compliance affidavit costs.
- 3. Up to 20 percent of the proceeds may be used to market and promote the Hispanic Achievers license plate.
- 4. Twenty-five percent of the proceeds shall be used by the Hispanic Corporate Achievers, Inc., located in Seminole County, for grants.
- 5. The remaining proceeds shall be available to the Hispanic Achievers Grant Council to award grants for services, programs, or scholarships for Hispanic and minority individuals and organizations throughout Florida. All grant recipients must provide to the Hispanic Achievers Grant Council an annual program and financial report regarding the use of grant funds. Such reports must be available to the public.
 - (d) Effective July 1, 2014, the Hispanic Achievers license

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plate will shift into the presale voucher phase, as provided in s. 320.08053(2)(b). National Hispanic Corporate Achievers, Inc., shall have 24 months to record a minimum of 1,000 sales. Sales include existing active plates and vouchers sold subsequent to July 1, 2014. During the voucher period, new plates may not be issued, but existing plates may be renewed. If, at the conclusion of the 24-month presale period, the requirement of a minimum of 1,000 sales has been met, the department shall resume normal distribution of the Hispanic Achievers license plate. If, after 24 months, the minimum of 1,000 sales has not been met, the department shall discontinue the Hispanic Achievers license plate. This subsection is repealed June 30, 2016.

(76) (80) FALLEN LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS LICENSE PLATES.—

- (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Police and Kids Foundation, Inc., which may use up to a maximum of 10 percent of the proceeds for marketing to promote and market the plate. All remaining proceeds shall be distributed to and used by the Police and Kids Foundation, Inc., for its operations, activities, programs, and projects The remainder of the proceeds shall be used by the Police and Kids Foundation, Inc., to invest and reinvest, and the interest earnings shall be used for the operation of the Police and Kids Foundation, Inc.
 - (80) DUCKS UNLIMITED LICENSE PLATES.-
- (a) The department shall develop a Ducks Unlimited license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. Ducks Unlimited license plates must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Conserving Florida Wetlands" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

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- (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to Ducks Unlimited, Inc., a nonprofit corporation under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, to be used as follows:
- 1. Up to 5 percent may be used for administrative costs and marketing of the plate.
- 2. A minimum of 95 percent shall be used in this state to support the mission and efforts of Ducks Unlimited, Inc., for the conservation, restoration, and management of Florida wetlands and associated habitats for the benefit of waterfowl, other wildlife, and people.
 - (81) PLAY BALL LICENSE PLATES.-
- (a) The department shall develop a Play Ball license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. Play Ball license plates must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Play Ball" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
- (b) The license plate annual use fees shall be distributed to American Dream Baseball, Inc., which may retain all proceeds from the annual use fees until the startup costs for developing and issuing the license plates have been recovered. Thereafter, American Dream Baseball, Inc., may use the proceeds as follows:
- 1. A maximum of 10 percent may be used for administrative costs of the organization associated with implementing the programs funded by proceeds derived from sales of the specialty license plate and for the promotion and marketing costs of the license plate.
 - 2. The remainder shall be used to fund the activities,



388 programs, and projects of American Dream Baseball, Inc. 389 (82) AMERICA THE BEAUTIFUL LICENSE PLATES. -(a) The department shall develop an America The Beautiful 390 391 license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The 392 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the 393 words "America The Beautiful" must appear on the plate. (b) The annual use fees from the plate shall be distributed 394 395 to the America the Beautiful Fund as follows: 10 percent to 396 offset its administrative, marketing and promotion costs, and 397 the remaining 85 percent for projects and programs teaching 398 character, leadership, and service to Florida youth; provision 399 of well-being and assistance in the military community; outdoor 400 education advancing self-sufficiency; wildlife conservation 401 including imperiled and managed species; the maintenance of 402 historic or culturally important sites, buildings, structures, 403 or objects, and the development and modification of playgrounds, 404 recreational areas, or other outdoor amenities, including 405 disability access. 406 (83) PROTECT POLLINATORS PLATES.-407 (a) The department shall develop a Protect Pollinators 408 license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The 409 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the 410 words "Protect Pollinators" must appear at the bottom of the 411 plate. 412 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be 413 distributed to the Florida Wildflower Foundation, Inc., which: 414 1. May use a maximum of 10 percent of the proceeds to 415 market, promote, and administer the Protect Pollinators plate. 416 2. Shall use the remainder of the proceeds to establish

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pollinator wildflower habitats, fund pollinator education and research programs, and promote awareness of pollinators, including butterflies, native bees and honeybees, hummingbirds, bats, and hundreds of other insects and animal pollinator species, and their importance to Florida agricultural success and the security of the food supply.

(84) FLORIDA NATIVE LICENSE PLATES.-

- (a) The department shall develop a Florida Native license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the word "Native" must appear at the bottom of the plate. The plate must contain a camouflage background that includes leaves, flowers, or fronds of a minimum of 12 different Florida native plants.
- (b)1. The department shall retain all annual use fees from the sale of the plate until all startup costs for developing and issuing the plate have been recovered.
- 2. Thereafter, the annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to Florida Native Plant Society, a Florida nonprofit corporation, which may use a maximum of 10 percent of such fees for administrative costs and to market and promote the plate. The balance of the fees shall be used by Florida Native Plant Society, to fulfill the mission of the Florida Native Plant Society, where 45 percent is dedicated to maintaining, improving, and restoring public native species, hunting and fishing habitats, and 45 percent is used to promote the cultivation of Florida's agricultural products through the preservation of native noncrop plants to provide habitats for pollinators and natural enemies to plant pests, and to provide pollen and nectar and undisturbed habitats for bee nesting



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- (85) DONATE LIFE FLORIDA LICENSE PLATES.-
- (a) The department shall develop a Donate Life Florida license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Donors Saves Lives" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
- (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to Donate Life Florida, which may use up to 10 percent of the proceeds for marketing and administrative costs. The remaining proceeds of the annual use fees shall be used by the Donate Life Florida to educate Florida residents on the importance of organ, tissue and eye donation and for the continued maintenance of the Joshua Abbott Organ and Tissue Donor Registry.
 - (86) SUN SEA SMILES LICENSE PLATES.-
- (a) The department shall develop a Sun Sea Smiles license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Sun Sea Smiles" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
- (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed as follows:
- 1. Five percent shall be distributed to the Florida Caribbean Charitable Foundation, Inc., to be used only for marketing of the Sun Sea Smiles license plate.
- 2. An additional 30 percent shall be distributed to the Florida Caribbean Charitable Foundation, Inc. Of this amount, up

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475 to 5 percent may be used for administrative expenses, and the 476 remainder shall be used as follows:

- a. Sixty percent shall be used for a college scholarship program.
- b. Fifteen percent shall be used to promote health and wellness for residents in this state who are of Caribbean descent.
- c. Twenty-five percent shall be used to promote awareness of Caribbean culture within this state.
- 3. Twenty percent shall be distributed to the American Friends of Jamaica, Inc., a charitable, not-for-profit organization under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code registered with the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and incorporated in New York, to be used as grants to promote social and community development among residents of this state. Of this amount, up to 5 percent may be used for administrative and marketing expenses.
- 4. Ten percent shall be distributed to Haitian Neighborhood Center Sant La, Inc., to be used to promote social and community development. Of this amount, up to 5 percent may be used for administrative expenses.
- 5. Ten percent shall be distributed to Fanm Ayisyen nan Miyami, Inc., to be used to promote social and community development. Of this amount, up to 10 percent may be used for administrative expenses.
- 6. Twenty percent shall be distributed to Greater Caribbean American Cultural Coalition, Inc., to be used to promote awareness of Caribbean culture within this state. Of this amount, up to 5 percent may be used for administrative expenses.



- 504 7. Five percent shall be distributed to Little Haiti Optimist Foundation, Inc., to be used to promote awareness of 505 506 Caribbean culture and youth development within this state. Of this amount, up to 5 percent may be used for administrative expenses. 509 (87) OMEGA PSI PHI FRATERNITY LICENSE PLATES.-(a) The department shall develop an Omega Psi Phi Fraternity license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by 513 the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the 514 plate, and the words "Omega Psi Phi" must appear at the bottom 515 of the plate. (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the State of Florida Omega Friendship Foundation, 518 Inc., to be used as follows: 519 1. Five percent shall be used solely for marketing of the 520 Omega Psi Phi Fraternity license plate. 521 2. Ninety-five percent shall be used for college scholarships for residents of the state attending historically 523 black colleges and universities in the state. 524 (88) DELTA SIGMA THETA SORORITY LICENSE PLATES.-525 (a) The department shall develop a Delta Sigma Theta Sorority license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Delta Sigma Theta" must appear at the 530 bottom of the plate.

 - (99) ETHICAL ECOTOURISM LICENSE PLATES.-

- (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed equally between the Florida Society for Ethical Ecotourism and Paddle Florida, Inc., each of which may use up to 10 percent of the proceeds for administrative costs and marketing of the plate. The Tampa Bay Auburn Club must distribute to each of the state's Auburn clubs on a pro-rata basis the moneys received from sales in the regions within the respective club's area for the purpose of awarding scholarships to Florida residents attending Auburn University. Students receiving these scholarships must be eligible for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program pursuant to s. 1009.531 and shall use the scholarship funds for tuition and other expenses related to attending Auburn University.
 - (102) BEAT CHILDHOOD CANCER LICENSE PLATES. -
- (a) The department shall develop a Beat Childhood Cancer license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Beat Childhood Cancer" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
- (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to Beat Nb, Inc., which may use up to 10 percent of the proceeds for administrative costs directly associated with the operation of the corporation and for marketing and promoting the plate. The remaining proceeds shall be used by the corporation to fund pediatric cancer treatment and research.
 - (103) AMERICAN EAGLE LICENSE PLATES.—

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- (a) The department shall develop an American Eagle license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "God Bless America" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
- (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the American Eagle Foundation for deposit in the foundation's national endowment fund. Up to 10 percent of the funds received may be used for administrative costs and marketing of the plate. The American Eagle Foundation shall use the remainder of the proceeds to fund public education programs, rescue and care programs, and other conservation efforts in Florida which benefit bald eagles.

- (1) (a) All organizations that receive annual use fee proceeds from the department are responsible for ensuring that proceeds are used in accordance with ss. 320.08056 and 320.08058.
- (b) Any organization not subject to audit pursuant to s. 215.97 shall annually attest, under penalties of perjury, that such proceeds were used in compliance with ss. 320.08056 and 320.08058. The attestation shall be made annually in a form and format determined by the department. In addition, the department shall audit any such organization every 2 years to ensure proceeds have been used in compliance with ss. 320.08056 and 320.08058.
- (c) Any organization subject to audit pursuant to s. 215.97 shall submit an audit report in accordance with rules promulgated by the Auditor General. The annual attestation shall be submitted to the department for review within 9 months after the end of the organization's fiscal year.
 - (2)(a) Within 120 days after receiving an organization's

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audit or attestation, the department shall determine which recipients of revenues from specialty license plate annual use fees have not complied with subsection (1). In determining compliance, the department may commission an independent actuarial consultant, or an independent certified public accountant, who has expertise in nonprofit and charitable organizations.

- (b) The department must discontinue the distribution of revenues to any organization failing to submit the required documentation as required in subsection (1), but may resume distribution of the revenues upon receipt of the required information.
- (c) If the department or its designee determines that an organization has not complied or has failed to use the revenues in accordance with ss. 320.08056 and 320.08058, the department must discontinue the distribution of the revenues to the organization. The department shall notify the organization of its findings and direct the organization to make the changes necessary in order to comply with this chapter. If the officers of the organization sign an affidavit under penalties of perjury stating that they acknowledge the findings of the department and attest that they have taken corrective action and that the organization will submit to a followup review by the department, the department may resume the distribution of revenues.
- (d) If an organization fails to comply with the department's recommendations and corrective actions as outlined in paragraph (c), the revenue distributions shall be discontinued until completion of the next regular session of the Legislature. The department shall notify the President of the

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Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by the first day of the next regular session of any organization whose revenues have been withheld as a result of this paragraph. If the Legislature does not provide direction to the organization and the department regarding the status of the undistributed revenues, the department shall deauthorize the plate and the undistributed revenues shall be immediately deposited into the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund.

(3) The department or its designee has the authority to examine all records pertaining to the use of funds from the sale of specialty license plates.

Each application shall be accompanied by proof that the applicant meets the qualifications specified in paragraph (a) or paragraph (b).

- (a) A citizen of the United States who served as a member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the armed forces of a nation allied with the United States who was held as a prisoner of war at such time as the Armed Forces of the United States were engaged in combat, or his or her unremarried surviving spouse, may be issued the special license plate provided for in this subsection without payment of the license tax imposed by s. 320.08.
- (b) A person who was serving as a civilian with the consent of the United States Government, or a person who was a member of the Armed Forces of the United States while he or she was not a United States citizen and was held as a prisoner of war when the Armed Forces of the United States were engaged in combat, or his or her unremarried surviving spouse, may be issued the special license plate provided for in this subsection upon payment of the license tax imposed by s. 320.08.
- (3) Each owner or lessee of an automobile or truck for private use, a truck weighing not more than 7,999 pounds, or a recreational vehicle as specified in s. 320.08(9)(c) or (d),

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which is not used for hire or commercial use who is a resident of this state and who is the unremarried surviving spouse of a recipient of the Purple Heart medal, upon application to the department accompanied by the payment of the required fees, shall be issued a license plate as provided in s. 320.06 which is stamped with the words "Purple Heart" and the likeness of the Purple Heart medal followed by the serial number. Each application shall be accompanied by proof that the applicant is the unremarried surviving spouse of a recipient of the Purple Heart medal.

- (4) The owner or lessee of an automobile or truck for private use, a truck weighing not more than 7,999 pounds, or a recreational vehicle as specified in s. 320.08(9)(c) or (d) which is not used for hire or commercial use who is a resident of this state and a current or former member of the United States Armed Forces who was deployed and served in Korea during the Korean War as defined in s. 1.01(14), upon application to the department accompanied by proof of active membership or former active duty status during the Korean War and payment of the license tax for the vehicle as provided in s. 320.08, shall be issued a license plate as provided by s. 320.06 which, in lieu of the registration license number prescribed by s. 320.06, is stamped with the words "Korean War Veteran" and a likeness of the Korean Service Medal, followed by the registration license number of the plate. Proof that the applicant was awarded the Korean Service Medal is sufficient to establish eligibility for the license plate.
- (5) The owner or lessee of an automobile or truck for private use, a truck weighing not more than 7,999 pounds, or a

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recreational vehicle as specified in s. 320.08(9)(c) or (d) which is not used for hire or commercial use who is a resident of this state and a current or former member of the United States military who was deployed and served in Vietnam during United States military deployment in Indochina, upon application to the department accompanied by proof of active membership or former active duty status during these operations and payment of the license tax for the vehicle as provided in s. 320.08, shall be issued a license plate as provided by s. 320.06 which, in lieu of the registration license number prescribed by s. 320.06, is stamped with the words "Vietnam War Veteran" and a likeness of the Vietnam Service Medal, followed by the registration license number of the plate. Proof that the applicant was awarded the Vietnam Service Medal is sufficient to establish eligibility for the license plate.

(6) The owner or lessee of an automobile or truck for private use, a truck weighing not more than 7,999 pounds, or a recreational vehicle as specified in s. 320.08(9)(c) or (d) which is not used for hire or commercial use who is a resident of this state and a current or former member of the United States military who was deployed and served in Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, or another area of the Persian Gulf during Operation Desert Shield or Operation Desert Storm; in Afghanistan during Operation Enduring Freedom; or in Iraq during Operation Iraqi Freedom, upon application to the department accompanied by proof of active membership or former active duty status during one of these operations and payment of the license tax for the vehicle as provided in s. 320.08, shall be issued a license plate as provided by s. 320.06 which, in lieu of the registration license



number prescribed by s. 320.06, is stamped with the words "Operation Desert Shield," "Operation Desert Storm," "Operation Enduring Freedom," or "Operation Iraqi Freedom," as appropriate, and a likeness of the related campaign medal followed by the registration license number of the plate. Proof that the applicant was awarded the Southwest Asia Service Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal, or Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal is sufficient to establish eligibility for the appropriate license plate.

Section 10. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect October 1, 2017.
