2	An act relating to the Florida Kidcare program;
3	establishing the Kidcare Operational Efficiency and
4	Health Care Improvement Workgroup to maximize the
5	return on investment and enhance the operational
6	efficiencies of the Florida Kidcare program; providing
7	for duties, staffing, and membership of the workgroup;
8	providing that members of the workgroup serve on a
9	voluntary basis; requiring a report to the Governor
10	and Legislature; providing for expiration of the
11	workgroup; providing an effective date.

13	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
14	
15	Section 1. Kidcare Operational Efficiency and Health Care
16	Improvement WorkgroupThe Kidcare Operational Efficiency and
17	Health Care Improvement Workgroup is established to maximize the
18	return on investment and streamline and enhance the operational
19	efficiencies of the Florida Kidcare program to provide improved
20	health care services to children. Members of the workgroup shall
21	serve on a voluntary basis.
22	(1) The workgroup shall be convened and staffed by the
23	Florida Healthy Kids Corporation and shall consist of the
24	following members:
25	(a) The President of the Florida Chapter of the American
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26	Academy of Pediatrics or a designee.
27	(b) The State Health Officer or a designee.
28	(c) The Secretary of Health Care Administration or a
29	designee with a background in children's health policy.
30	(d) The assistant secretary for child welfare of the
31	Department of Children and Families or a designee.
32	(e) A representative of directors of the Florida Healthy
33	Kids Corporation.
34	(f) A representative of the Florida Association of
35	Children's Hospitals, Inc.
36	(g) A representative of the Florida Covering Kids and
37	Families Coalition.
38	(h) A representative of the Florida Association of Health
39	Plans.
40	(i) A representative of the Florida Children's Council
41	with a background in children's health policy.
42	(j) The Director of Children's Medical Services or a
43	designee.
44	(k) A parent with a child in the Florida Kidcare program.
45	(2) The workgroup shall:
46	(a) Examine successful and innovative models to provide
47	improved value and health care outcomes.
48	(b) Develop recommendations to streamline and unify the
49	program to provide greater operational efficiencies, including
50	recommendations for a single benefits package, a single set of
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51	performance measures, and a single third-party administrator.
52	(c) Provide any necessary transition plans.
53	(d) Provide recommendations regarding federal waivers for
54	children's health care to the Agency for Health Care
55	Administration, which shall obtain specific legislative
56	authorization before seeking, applying for, accepting, or
57	renewing any federal waiver.
58	(3) The workgroup shall submit a report on its findings
59	and recommendations for streamlining the Florida Kidcare program
60	to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of
61	the House of Representatives by December 31, 2017.
62	(4) This section expires December 31, 2017.
63	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2017.

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
