6 Between lines 1242 and 1243, insert:

7 Section 12. Subsection (13) of section 465.003, Florida
 8 Statutes, is amended to read:

9 465.003 Definitions.—As used in this chapter, the term:

10 (13) "Practice of the profession of pharmacy" includes
 11 compounding, dispensing, and consulting concerning contents,
 12 therapeutic values, and uses of any medicinal drug; consulting
 13 concerning therapeutic values and interactions of patent or
 14 proprietary preparations, whether pursuant to prescriptions or
 15 in the absence and entirely independent of such prescriptions or
 16 orders; and other pharmaceutical services. For purposes of this

17 subsection, "other pharmaceutical services" means the monitoring
18 of the patient's drug therapy and assisting the patient in the
19 management of his or her drug therapy, and includes review of
20 the patient's drug therapy and communication with the patient's
21 prescribing health care provider as licensed under chapter 458,
22 chapter 459, chapter 461, or chapter 466, or similar statutory
23 provision in another jurisdiction, or such provider's agent or
24 such other persons as specifically authorized by the patient,
25 regarding the drug therapy. However, nothing in this subsection
26 may be interpreted to permit an alteration of a prescriber's
27 directions, the diagnosis or treatment of any disease, the
28 initiation of any drug therapy, the practice of medicine, or the
29 practice of osteopathic medicine, unless otherwise permitted by
30 law. "Practice of the profession of pharmacy" also includes any
31 other act, service, operation, research, or transaction
32 incidental to, or forming a part of, any of the foregoing acts,
33 requiring, involving, or employing the science or art of any
34 branch of the pharmaceutical profession, study, or training, and
35 shall expressly permit a pharmacist to transmit information from
36 persons authorized to prescribe medicinal drugs to their
37 patients. The practice of the profession of pharmacy also
38 includes the administration of vaccines to adults and the
39 ordering and evaluation of tests for influenza pursuant to s.
40 465.189.

41 Section 13. Subsections (3), (4), (5), (6), (7), and (8)
42 of section 465.189, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as
43 subsections (4), (5), (6), (7), (8), and (9), respectively, and
44 subsection (3) is added to that section and renumbered
45 subsection (5) is amended, to read:

46 465.189 Administration of vaccines and epinephrine
47 autoinjection; test for influenza.—

48 (3) A pharmacist who is certified under subsection (7)
49 may, within the framework of an established protocol under a
50 supervising physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459,
51 order and evaluate a laboratory or clinical test for influenza.

52 (54) A pharmacist administering vaccines or testing for
53 influenza under this section shall maintain and make available
54 patient records using the same standards for confidentiality and
55 maintenance of such records as those that are imposed on health
56 care practitioners under s. 456.057. These records shall be
57 maintained for a minimum of 5 years.
