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House Memorial

A memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging Congress to establish Medicaid block grants.

5 WHEREAS, the Florida Medicaid program covers over four 6 million people at a cost of \$25.8 billion in fiscal year 2016-7 2017, or 31 percent of the total state budget, and grows in cost 8 and enrollment each year, and

9 WHEREAS, nationally, the vast majority of the increase in 10 insurance coverage under the federal Patient Protection and 11 Affordable Care Act is due to increased enrollment in Medicaid, 12 not increased enrollment in employer-based or other private 13 coverage, and

14 WHEREAS, nationally, the Medicaid program is a stigmatizing 15 welfare program that achieves poor quality outcomes and 16 segregates taxpayer-supported, low-income patients from the 17 health coverage market used by privately supported patients, and

18 WHEREAS, the Medicaid program is a federally prescribed, 19 complex system of eligibility, financing, and service delivery 20 models, subject to extensive, complicated, prescriptive, and 21 outdated federal laws and regulations, and

22 WHEREAS, opportunities for innovation and modernization 23 under the Medicaid program are limited and only available 24 through waivers of federal law awarded in an unpredictable 25 manner after lengthy bureaucratic negotiations, and

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26	WHEREAS, the current financing model of federal matching
27	funds encourages states to shift state spending into the
28	Medicaid program, which drives up costs and creates a perverse
29	economic incentive such that states gain little benefit from
30	efficiency and bear little risk for wasteful expenditures, and
31	WHEREAS, a reasonable, predictable funding mechanism that
32	does not incentivize state spending increases will force states
33	to make more rational, efficient spending choices, naturally
34	reducing the rate of cost growth, and
35	WHEREAS, granting states complete flexibility with regard
36	to eligibility, benefits, and state investment, while holding
37	states to mutually agreeable quality outcomes, will help states
38	transform the Medicaid program into an innovative consumer-
39	driven, free-market program that integrates enrollees into the
40	larger health care system, NOW, THEREFORE,
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42	Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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44	(1) That the Congress of the United States is requested to
45	establish Medicaid block grants in lieu of providing funding
46	under Title XIX of the Social Security Act;
47	(2) That Medicaid block grants shall consist of risk-
48	adjusted, income-adjusted, per capita amounts for each state
49	based on current federal funding and annually indexed for
50	inflation;
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51 (3) That Medicaid block grants shall allow states to 52 design new Medicaid programs not subject to the requirements of 53 Title XIX of the Social Security Act and regulations adopted 54 thereunder, but which shall be subject to quality monitoring by 55 the Federal Government based on mutually agreed-upon outcome 56 measures; and

57 (4) That Medicaid block grants shall be implemented in a
58 multiyear transition to eliminate funding disparities between
59 states.

60 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be 61 dispatched to the President of the United States, to the 62 President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the 63 United States House of Representatives, and to each member of 64 the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.

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
